TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDER

THE THREE RIVERS DISTRICT COUNCIL (WAITING RESTRICTIONS) (STAG LANE AND RYMAN COURT, CHORLEYWOOD) ORDER 20**

The Three Rivers District Council ("the Council"), pursuant to arrangements made under Section 19 of the Local Government Act 2000 and the Local Government (Arrangements for Discharge of Functions) (England) Regulations 2000 with the Hertfordshire County Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred on that County Council under Sections 1, 2, 3 and 4 and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act of 1984") and of all other enabling powers, and after consulting with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as The Three Rivers (Waiting Restrictions) (Stag Lane and Ryman Court, Chorleywood) Order 2012 and shall come into operation on 16th April 2012.

2. In this Order –

"The Council" means the Three Rivers District Council.

"Civil Enforcement Officer (CEO)" means a Civil Enforcement Officer appointed by the Council under Section 76 of the Traffic Management Act 2004.

"Disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in Section 142(1) of the Act of 1984.

"Disabled person's badge" and "parking disc" have the same meanings as in Regulation 3(1) of the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000 and "relevant position" has the same meaning as in Regulation 4 of those Regulations.

"Universal service provider," "Provision of a universal postal service" and "Postal packet" each has the same meaning as in the Postal Services Act 2000.

"Schedule" means a Schedule to this Order.

3. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

4. Save as provided in Article 5 or 6 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer appointed by the Council, cause or permit any vehicle to wait on any length of road referred to in Schedule 1 to this Order at the times specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.
5. Nothing in Article 4 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on any length of road referred to therein, for so long as may be necessary to enable –
 - (a)a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b)a person to load or unload the vehicle;
 - (c)the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely –
 - (i) ...building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) ...the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) ...the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the highway;
 - (iv)the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or adjacent to the said lengths of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any electronic communication network within the meaning of the Communications Act 2003;
 - (d)the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or other authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (e)the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets by a "Universal service provider" as defined in the Postal Services Act 2000;
 - (f)the vehicle to be used for Fire and Rescue Service, Ambulance or Police purpose.

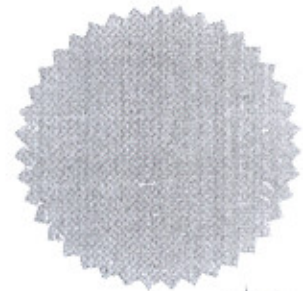
6. Nothing in Article 4 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause a vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a parking disc (on which the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on any of the lengths of roads referred to in that Article for a period not exceeding three hours (not being separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same length of road on the same day), provided that such period lies entirely within the period during which loading is permitted in that location.
- 7 The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to, and not in derogation of, any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulation made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.

SCHEDULE 1 – Waiting Restrictions

Item Number	Location	Restricted hours
		refer Schedule 2

01 Stag Lane, Chorleywood

The southeast side: from a point aligned with the south west boundary of Ryman Court northeast to a point aligned with the southwest boundary of Chorleywood Primary School. **A**

02 The private access road on the northeast side of Ryman Court (owned and maintained by Three Rivers District Council).

02 a) Both sides: From its junction with Stag lane to a point opposite the return of the concrete edging, on its southwest side, at the commencement of the residents' parking places a distance of approximately 4.75 metres southeast of the highway boundary of Stag Lane. **A**

02 b) Northeast side: From a point opposite the return of the concrete edging at the commencement of the residents' parking places (a distance of approximately 4.75 metres southeast of the highway boundary of Stag Lane) southeast to a point 13 metres southeast of the highway boundary of Stag Lane. **A**

02 c) Northeast side: From a point 13 metres southeast of the highway boundary of Stag Lane to the end of the access road at the commencement of the garage court a distance of approximately 83 metres. **B**
