**ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 - SECTIONS 1, 2 AND 124**  
**THE KENT COUNTY COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS, WOULDHAM)**  
**(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER, 1992**

The Kent County Council in exercise of its powers under Sections 1, 2 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the said Act of 1984, hereby makes the following order:-

1. "The Kent County Council (Various Roads, Wouldham) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1977", as having effect by virtue of Section 144(1) and paragraph 3 of Schedule 10 to the Act of 1984, is hereby revoked.
2. Save as provided in Articles 3, 4 and 5 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden cause or permit any vehicle to wait at all times in the lengths of roads specified in the Schedule to this Order.
3. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to in that Article for so long as may be necessary:-
  - (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
  - (b) to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle;
  - (c) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose elsewhere, to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the carrying out of any roadworks or the laying, erection, alteration or repair of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telegraph or telephone wires, cables, posts or supports; or
  - (d) to enable the vehicle to wait at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to the length of road for so long as such waiting is reasonably necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral; or
  - (e) to enable the vehicle to be used for police, fire brigade, or ambulance purposes.
4. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to in the Schedule to this Order for a period not exceeding 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road).
5. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the said Act of 1984, or by or under any other enactment.

6. In this Order:-

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 1991;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1991;

"parking disc" means a disc, issued by a local authority, 125mm square, coloured orange, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins; and


"relevant position" means:-

- (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the badge is exhibited thereon so that Part 1 of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle, or
- (ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that Part 1 of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle.

7. This Order shall come into operation on the sixth day of March 1992 and may be cited as "The Kent County Council (Various Roads, Wouldham) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1992."

SCHEDULE  
(No waiting at any time)

LENGTHS OF ROAD IN THE PARISH OF WOULDHAM

- (i) High Street:-
  - (a) from the centre of the junction with Knowle Road/Hall Road in a northerly direction for a distance of 20 metres; and
  - (b) from a point 10 metres north of its junction with Portland Road for a distance of 20 metres in a southerly direction.
- (ii) Knowle Road - from the centre of the junction with High Street/Hall Road in an easterly direction for a distance of 20 metres.
- (iii) Hall Road - from the centre of the junction with High Street/Knowle Road in a southerly direction for a distance of 26 metres.
- (iv) Portland Road - from its junction with High Street for a distance of 3 metres in a westerly direction.
