ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984-SECTIONS 1,2 AND 124

THE KENT COUNTY COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS, EAST PECKHAM)

(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 1994

The Kent County Council in exercise of its powers under Sections 1,2 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the said Act of 1984, hereby makes the following Order:-

- 1. "The Kent County Council (Various Roads, East Peckham) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1983", as having effect by virtue of Section 144(1) of and paragraph 3 of Schedule 10 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 is hereby revoked.
- 2. Save as provided in Articles 3 and 4 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Traffic Warden cause or permit any vehicle to wait:
 - a) in any of the lengths of road specified in the First Schedule to this Order; or
 - b) between the hours of 8.30 am and 6.30 pm on Mondays to Saturdays in the length of road specified in the Second Schedule to this Order.
- 3. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in any of the lenths of road referred to in that Article for so long as may be necessary:
 - a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - b) to enable goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle:
 - c) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose elsewhere, to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the carrying out of any roadworks or the laying, erection, and alteration or repair of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telegraph or telephone wires, cables, posts or supports; or
 - d) to enable the vehicle to be used for Police, Ambulance or Fire Brigade purposes.
- 4. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled persons vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled persons badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to in the Schedule to this Order for a period not exceeding 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road).
- 5. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to

and not in derogation of any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the said Act of 1984, or by or under any other enactment.

6. In this Order:-

"disabled persons vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons)

England and Wales) Regulations 1991;

"disabled persons badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1991;

"parking disc" means a disc, issued by a Local Authority, 125mm in diameter, coloured orange, and capable of showing the quarter 'hour period during which a period of waiting begins; and

"relevant position" means:-

- i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the badge is exhibited thereon so that Part I of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle; or
- ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that Part I of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle.
- 7. This Order shall come into operation on the Twenty Fourth day of June 1994 and may be cited as "The Kent County Council (Various Roads, East Peckham) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1994".

FIRST SCHEDULE (No waiting at any time)

Lengths of road in the Parish of East Peckham

1. Old Road:-

- a) on the north east side from the centre of its junction with The Freehold for a distance of 30 metres in a south easterly direction; and
- b) on the north side from the centre of its junction with Orchard Road for a distance of 15 metres in an easterly direction and 15 metres in a westerly direction.
- 2. Pound Road, on the north east side, from the centre of its junction with The Freehold to a point 15 metres north west of the centre line of the entrance to Curran Hall Car Park.
- 3. Orchard Road, both sides, from its junction with Old Road for a distance of 15 metres in a northerly direction.
 - 4. The entrance to Curran Hall Car Park, from its junction with Pound Road for a distance of 15 metres in a north easterly direction.

SECOND SCHEDULE (No waiting 8.30 am to 6.30 pm on Mondays to Saturdays)

Length of road at East Peckham

Pound Road on the south west side from a point opposite the north flank wall of the Post Office (No 9 Pound Road) for a distance of 47 metres in a north westerly direction to the southern kerb line Fell Mead.
