

## THE VALE OF GLAMORGAN COUNCIL (B4524 OGMORE (PART) 24 HOUR RURAL CLEARWAY) ORDER 2022

The Vale of Glamorgan Council in exercise of its powers under Sections 1(1), 2, 2(1), 2(2), 2(3) and 84 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended) and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of South Wales Police, in accordance with Part 11 of Schedule 9 of the said Act hereby makes the following Order as more particularly described in the Schedule below.

This Order shall come into operation on 16th January 2023 or on the date that the appropriate signs and road markings are in place whichever is the later and may be cited as "The Vale of Glamorgan Council (B4524 Ogmore (Part) 24 Hour Rural Clearway) Order 2022

Except as expressly provided by this Order the restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulation made or having effect as if made under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended).

The following Traffic Regulation Order is to be amended as follows: Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting and Loading and Parking Places (Civil Enforcement) Order 2013

## SCHEDULE 1

No person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or a Traffic Warden cause or permit any vehicle to stop at any time on the length of highway as described in Schedule 2.


