The Borough of Watford (Regent Street, Cecil Street, Judge Street) (Parking Places) (Disabled Persons) Order 2006

Made on: 9 March 2006  
 Coming into force on: 20 March 2006

---

The Watford Borough Council, pursuant to arrangements made under Section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with the Hertfordshire County Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred on that County Council under sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3) and 32(1) and 35(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) (hereinafter referred to as "the act of 1984") and of all other enabling powers and after consulting with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby make the following Order:

1. This Order may be cited as the Borough of Watford (Regent Street, Cecil Street, Judge Street) (Parking Places) (Disabled Persons) Order 2006 and shall come into force on 20 March 2006.
2. In this Order:
 

"Council" means Watford Borough Council;

"parking attendant" means a person authorised by or on behalf of the Council to supervise the restrictions and prohibitions of this Order;

"provision of a universal postal service", "universal service provider" and "postal packet" have the same meanings as in the Postal Services Act 2000 (b);

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as Section 142(1) of the Act of 1984;

"disabled person's badge" and "parking disc" have the same meaning as in regulation 3 (1) of the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000 (c), and "relevant position" has the same meaning as in regulation 4 of those regulations;
3. Save as provided in Article 4 and 5 of this Order, the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this order is authorised for use as parking places at any time for disabled person's vehicles which display in the relevant position a disabled badge.
4. Save as provided in Article 5 of this Order, where in Article 3 of this Order a parking place is described as authorised for use as a parking place, the driver of a vehicle shall not permit the vehicle to wait in that parking place unless it is:

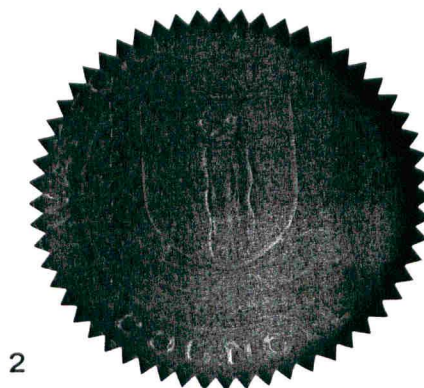

- (a) a disabled person's vehicle on which is displayed in the relevant position a disabled person's badges;
  - (b) wholly within the marked limits of the parking place.
5. (1) Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this Order
- (a) a person to board or alight from a vehicle;
  - (b) the vehicle if it cannot be conveniently used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely;
    - (i) building industrial and demolition operations;
    - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to any traffic;
    - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said length of road;
    - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said length of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus defined in paragraph 1(1) of the telecommunications Code contained in Schedule 2 of the telecommunication Act 1984;
    - (v) to a vehicle being used for fire an rescue service, ambulance or police purposes;
  - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
  - (d) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in the Postal Services Act 2000.
6. The Interpretation Act 1978 (1978 c.30) applies to this order as if it were an enactment
7. The restrictions, prohibitions and requirements imposed by this Order are in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction, prohibition or requirement imposed by any other enactment and any exception or exemption from the provisions of this Order is without prejudice to the provisions of any other enactment.

## SCHEDULE

Lengths of road authorised as parking places by this Order for use by Disabled Badge Holders at any time.

No. of Parking Place 1	Road Name 2	Authorised Parking Place 3
1.	Regent Street	Southern side, From a point 12 metres west of the western kerb-line of St Albans Road for a length of 6.6 metres in an westerly direction.
2.	Cecil Street	Southern Side, From a point 12 metres west of the western kerb-line of St Albans Road for a length of 6.6 metres in an westerly direction.
3.	Judge Street	On the south-west side, From a point 13 metres west of the western kerb-line of St Albans Road for a length of 6.6 metres in an westerly direction.
