**THE BOROUGH OF WATFORD (NASCOT AREA)
(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 2000**

The Watford Borough Council, pursuant to arrangements made under Section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with the Hertfordshire County Council, and in exercise of powers conferred on that County under Sections 1, 2 and 4(2) to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as The Borough of Watford (Nascot area) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 2000 and shall come into operation on 19th October 2000

2. (1) In this Order -

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in Section 142(1) of the Act of 1984

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in Section 142(1) of the Act of 1984

"parking disc" means a disc, issued by a local authority, 125mm square, coloured orange, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins.

and

"relevant position" means

(i) a vehicle displays a disabled person's badge issued before 2 March 1992 in the relevant position if-

(a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen, and with its front facing forward so as to be legible from outside the vehicle, or

(b) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle

(ii) a vehicle displays a disabled person's badge issued on or after 2 March 1992 in the relevant position if -

- (a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the badge is exhibited thereon so that Part I of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle, or
 - (b) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that Part I of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle, and
 - (iii) a vehicle displays a parking disc in the relevant position if –
 - (a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or panel, the disc is exhibited thereon so that the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle, or
 - (b) in the case of a vehicle not so fitted, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle.
- (2) The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
3. Save as provided in Articles 4 and 5 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the sides of road or the lengths of road referred to in Schedule 1
4. Nothing in Articles 3 and 4 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on any of the sides of road or lengths of road referred to therein, for so long as may be necessary to enable –
- (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle
 - (b) loading or unloading
 - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely –
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;

- (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said sides of road or lengths of road;
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said sides of road or lengths of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telecommunication apparatus as define in Paragraph 1(1) of the Telecommunications Code contained in Schedule 2 to the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - (d) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (e) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collection postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953;
 - (f) the vehicle to be used for Fire Brigade, Ambulance or Police purposes;
5. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a parking disc (on which the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on any of the sides of road or in the lengths of road referred to in that Article, for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same side of road or in the same length of road on the same day), provided that such period lies entirely within the period during which loading is permitted in that location.
6. The prohibitions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to, and not in derogation of, any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulation made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.

Schedule 1
No Waiting At Any Time

1. Church Road

- a) north side
 - (i) from a point 10 metres west of its junction with Grange Close in an easterly direction for a distance of 16 metres
 - (ii) from a point 36 metres east of its junction with Grange Close in an easterly direction for a distance 25 metres

- (iii) from a point 63 metres east of its junction with Grange Close in an easterly direction for a distance of 36 metres
- 2. Grandfield Avenue
 - a) north west side (i) from its junction with Langley Road in a south westerly direction for a distance of 36 metres
 - b) south east side (i) from its junction with Langley Road in a south westerly direction for a distance of 36 metres
- 3. Langley Road
 - a) south west side (i) from a point 10 metres north of its junction with Grandfield Avenue in a south easterly direction for a distance of 26 metres
- 4. Langwood Gardens (north east arm)
 - a) north west side (i) from a point 10 metres south west of its junction with Langley Road in a south westerly direction for a distance of 15 metres
 - (ii) from its junction with the north west arm off Langwood Gardens to a point 15 metres north east of that junction
 - b) south east side (i) from a point 10 metres south west of its junction with Langley Road in a south westerly direction for a distance of 15 metres
 - (ii) from its junction with Pinewood Close to a point 15 metres north east of that junction
- 4. Langwood Gardens (north west arm)
 - a) north east side (i) from its junction with the north west arm of Langwood Gardens to a point 15 metres north west of that junction
 - b) south west side (i) from its junction with Maple Grove to a point 15 metres north east of that junction
- 5. Maple Grove
 - a) north west side (i) from its junction with the north west arm of Langwood Gardens to a point 10 metres south west of that junction
 - b) south east side (i) from its junction with Pinewood Close to a point 10 metres south west of that junction.


6. Pinewood Close

(i) from its junction with the north east arm of
Langwood Gardens to point 7 metres south of
that junction

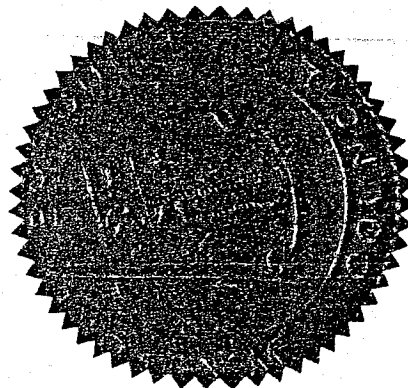
b) west side
