

THE BOROUGH OF WATFORD (LEAVESDEN ROAD/LOWESTOFT ROAD)  
(PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING) ORDER 1972

The Council of the Borough of Watford in exercise of their powers under section 1(1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, and of all other powers them enabling in that behalf, and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with section 84C(1) of the said Act of 1967, hereby make the following Order -

1. Save as provided in Article 3 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the sides of road or in any of the lengths of road specified in Schedule 1 to this Order.
2. Save as provided in Article 3 of this Order nor person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on any day other than a Sunday on the sides of road or in any of the lengths of road specified in Schedule 2 of this Order.
3. (1) Nothing in Article 1 or in Article 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the sides of road or in any of the lengths of road referred to in that Article, as the case may be, for so long as may be necessary.
  - (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
  - (b) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the side of road or the length of road so referred to or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near the said side of road or the said length of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act 1878;
  - (c) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties, or
  - (d) to enable the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said side of road or the said length of road.

(2) Nothing in Article 1 or in Article 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths or the sides of the lengths of road referred to in that Article, as the case may be, for so long as may be necessary for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle.

Provided that this paragraph shall not apply so as to exempt any person from the prohibition contained in the said Article 1 in so far as that prohibition applies to the sides of lengths of road specified in Schedule 3 to this Order and in so far as any time necessary for the purpose before mentioned in this paragraph falls between the hours of 8 a.m. and 9.30 a.m. or between the hours of 5 p.m. and 6.30 p.m. on any day other than a Sunday unless -

- (a) the vehicle is in the service of or employed by the Post Office and is in actual use in any of the sides or lengths of road specified in the said Schedule 3 for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953,

- (b) so as to enable the vehicle to be loaded or unloaded while it is in actual use in connection with the removal of furniture from one office or dwelling house to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository, provided notice of any such removal shall have been given twenty-four hours in advance to the chief officer of police, his consent is obtained and such reasonable conditions as he may impose are complied with.
4. The Borough of Watford (Leavesden Road) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1966, is hereby revoked.
5. The Borough of Watford (North Watford) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1972 shall have effect as if item 8 (Leavesden Road) in Schedule 2 to the said Order was omitted.
6. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended aforesaid or by or under any other enactment.
7. The Interpretation Act 1889 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
8. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st May 1972, and may be cited as the Borough of Watford (Leavesden Road/Lowestoft Road) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1972.

SCHEDULE 1

Lengths and sides of lengths of road in the Borough of Watford

1. Leavesden Road
- (a) the east side, between its junction with St. Albans Road and its junction with Lowestoft Road.
  - (b) the west side, between its junction with St. Albans Road and its junction with Copsewood Road.
2. Lowestoft Road
- (a) the north side, from its junction with St Albans Road in a westerly direction for a distance of 70 metres.
  - (b) the south side, between its junction with St. Albans Road and its junction with Leavesden Road.

SCHEDULE 2

Lengths and sides of lengths of road in the Borough of Watford

1. Leavesden Road
- (a) the east side, between its junction with Lowestoft Road and its junction with Gammons Lane;
  - (b) the west side -
    - (i) between its junction with Copsewood Road and its junction with Parker Street.
    - (ii) between its junction with Jubilee Road and its junction with Gammons

SCHEDULE 2 (Continued)

2. Lowestoft Road

the north side, from its junction with Leavesden Road to a point 70 metres west of its junction with St. Albans Road.

SCHEDULE 3

Sides of lengths of road in the Borough of Watford

1. Leavesden Road

(a) the east side, from its junction with St. Albans Road in a northerly direction for a distance of 30 metres.

(b) the west side, from its junction with St. Albans Road in a northerly direction for a distance of 40 metres.
