### THE ADUR DISTRICT (OFF-STREET PARKING PLACES) (CIVIL ENFORCEMENT AND CONSOLIDATION) ORDER 2011

The Adur District Council (hereinafter called "the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 32, 35 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended ("the 1984 Act") and of all other enabling powers, with the consent of the County Council of West Sussex in accordance with section 39(3) of the 1984 Act and after consultation with the Chief Constable of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act hereby makes the following Order:

### PÄRT 1 GENERAL

### Commencement and Citation

### Interpretation

- 2. In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings respectively assigned to them:
  - "bank holiday" has the same meaning as described in the 'Banking and Financial dealings Act 1971 (C.80). The first Monday of May shall be treated as if it were a Bank Holiday for the purposes of this Order;
  - "charging days", means those days which are as specified in the Schedule for each parking place respectively;
  - "charging hours", means the period as specified in the Schedule on all charging days;

"Council" means the Adur District Council or its successor authority and includes any parking services contractors or authorised agent appointed by or acting on behalf of the Council;

"Civil Enforcement Officer" has the same meaning assigned to it by Part 6 of the Traffic Management Act 2004;

"daily charge" means the charge imposed by the Council for parking in a parking place on any one day and for a specified period of time as is identified in the scale of charges specified in the Schedule;

"disabled persons' badge" means a badge issued by any Local Authority in accordance with the provisions of the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons (England) Regulations 2000 or a badge having effect under those regulations as if it were a disabled person's badge);

"expiry time" is the time indicated on the pay and display ticket and is the time by which the vehicle must leave the parking place;

"motor cycle" refers to a solo motorcycle only and excludes any motor cycle which has a side-car or trailer, or which has more than two wheels;

"owner" in relation to a vehicle means the person who is recorded as the registered keeper by the Driver and Vehicle Licensing Agency on the date on which the vehicle was parked in the parking place in question;

"park" and "parked" refer to the stopping of a vehicle and it remaining at rest for more time than is necessary to set down or pick up passengers whether or not the driver is still in the vehicle and a vehicle shall be deemed to be parked for any period in the same parking place or parking bay (as the case may be) if any part of it is below the vehicle or the vehicle's load (if any) whether or not the vehicle is moved during that period;

"parking bay" means an area of a parking place, which is provided for the leaving of a vehicle of a class specified and indicated by markings on the surface of the parking place or signed or otherwise indicated by signs in the parking place;

"parking disc" means a device (a clock) which is i) 125 millimetres square and coloured blue and ii) has been issued by a local authority and has not ceased to be valid and iii) is capable of showing the quarter hour period from when the vehicles is first parked and throughout the period of parking;

"parking permit" means a permit of a type and design issued by the Council subject to certain conditions, valid for the period specified on the permit for use in parking places specified and indicated on the permit;

"parking place" means an area of land, specified by name in the Schedule and identified on the appropriate plan incorporated into this Order, provided by the Council pursuant to Section 32(1) of the 1984 Act for the purpose of parking of vehicles and not closed (in part or in whole) by a notice erected thereon by authority of the Council;

"pay and display ticket" means a ticket issued by a ticket machine located in the parking place in which the vehicle has been parked or issued by a person nominated by the Council on payment of a charge and valid for a parking period as advertised at that parking place;

"penalty charge" means a charge imposed by legislation in respect of parking contraventions that are subject to civil enforcement and has the same meaning as in the Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (England) General Regulations 2007;

"penalty charge notice" means a notice issued by a Civil Enforcement Officer in accordance with Regulations 9 and 10 of the Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (England) General Regulations 2007;

"plan" means a plan of a parking place incorporated into this order.

### "relevant position" means

- (a) in respect of a vehicle displaying a valid disabled person's badge -
  - (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the badge is exhibited thereon so that Part 1 (the front of the badge), is legible from outside the vehicle; or
  - (ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that Part 1 of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle;
- (b) in respect of a vehicle displaying a pay and display ticket, season ticket, parking permit or parking disc-
  - (i) the ticket, season ticket, parking permit or parking disc is exhibited on the inside surface of the windscreen or in a clearly visible position so that it is facing forwards and can be easily seen and read from the front or side of the vehicle;
  - (ii) in the case of a vehicle or trailer that is not fitted with a transparent windscreen, the ticket, season ticket, parking permit or parking disc is exhibited on the front of the vehicle facing forwards not more than 2 metres and not less than 750 millimetres above the surface of the parking place and is clearly visible and able to be read; or
  - (iii) in the case of a motor cycle having a side car attached, the ticket, season ticket, parking permit or parking disc is exhibited so that it is facing forwards and can be easily seen and read from the front or side of the vehicle;

"season ticket" means a parking ticket purchased, subject to certain conditions, valid for the period specified on the ticket for use in parking places specified and indicated on the ticket;

"ticket machine" means an apparatus of a type and design approved by the appropriate Minister for the purpose of the 1984 Act, being apparatus

designed to indicate the time by a clock and to issue parking tickets which show that a payment has been made of an amount or for a period specified thereon and which specify the date and, either the time of such payment, or the expiry time of the parking period for which payment has been made;

"trailer" means a wheeled device, including a caravan, designed or adapted to be drawn by a vehicle;

"vehicle" includes any motor car, motor cycle or other mechanically propelled automobile.

- 3. Except where the context requires otherwise, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article, Schedule or plan shall be construed as a reference to the Article bearing that number in this Order, the Schedule in the Order or the plan incorporated into this Order.
- 4. Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
- 5. Unless the context otherwise requires, words denoting the singular shall include the plural and vice versa and words denoting the persons shall include either gender, bodies corporate, unincorporated associations and partnerships.
- 6. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order.

### PART 2 DESIGNATION AND USE OF PARKING PLACES

### <u>Designation</u>

7. Each area of land or building specified by name in the Schedule and in the accompanying Plans may be used, subject to the provisions of this Order, as a place to park vehicles of such classes, in such positions, on such days,

during such hours, for such period and on payment of such charges as are specified in this Order.

### Class and position of vehicle

- 8. Where in the Schedule the parking place, or any parking bay within the parking place, is described as available for vehicles of a specified class or for vehicles to be parked in a specified location, no person shall cause or permit a vehicle to wait or park in that parking place or in any parking bay within the parking place,
  - (i) unless it is of the specified class;
  - (ii) unless it is wholly within the specified marked parking bay; or
  - (iii) it is in a position other than that specified

### Classes of vehicle

 No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be parked in a parking bay unless it is of a class specified in the Schedule.

### Position of vehicle

- 10. If parking bays are marked out in a parking place the driver of a vehicle shall ensure that it is positioned wholly within a parking bay and shall not permit it to wait or park in that parking place unless it is so positioned.
- 11. If parking bays are not marked out in a parking place the driver of a vehicle shall ensure that it is positioned so that it does not obstruct other vehicles using the parking place, the free flow of traffic circulating within the parking place and the entrances to and exits from the parking place.

### Disabled person's parking bays

12. No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be parked in a parking bay marked for disabled persons unless the vehicle displays a valid disabled person's badge in the relevant position and a parking disc and immediately before or immediately after the act of parking the vehicle has been or is about to be used by the person(s) in respect of whom the disabled person's badge has been issued.

### Permit parking bays

13. No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to park in a parking place or parking bay marked for parking permit holders only unless the vehicle is displaying in the relevant position a parking permit valid for that time and that parking place or parking bay.

### Motor cycle parking bays

14. No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to park in a parking bay marked for motor cycles unless the vehicle is a motor cycle.

### Hours of operation and maximum period of stay

- 15. Where specified in the Schedule a parking place or any parking bay within the parking place is described as being in operation on specified days, during specified hours or for a maximum period of stay, no person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be parked in that parking place or in any parking bay within the parking place on any day, during such hours or for any period other or longer than those specified.
- 16. Save for vehicles displaying a valid parking permit and notwithstanding any shorter time limits specified in the Schedule in specific parking places, no person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be parked in any parking place or in any parking bay within the parking place for any period longer than 24 hours.

### Period of no return

17. Where in the Schedule a parking place is described as having a period within which a vehicle may not return, no person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be parked again in that parking place on any day, during such hours within which the vehicle is excluded from parking in the parking place.

### Disabled persons' vehicles

18. Where a vehicle correctly parked in a parking place except a permit only parking place is displaying a valid disabled person's badge in the relevant position and a parking disc and immediately before or immediately after the

act of parking the vehicle has been or is about to be used by the person(s) in respect of whom the disabled person's badge has been issued, that vehicle shall be exempt from payment of the daily charge. A vehicle displaying a valid disabled person's badge in the relevant position and a parking disc is limited to a stay in all the parking places referred to in the Schedule for a maximum stay of four hours. For avoidance of doubt, this is a maximum of four hours regardless of whether or not the parking place in question has a longer maximum stay period.

### Power to close or suspend parking places

- 19. Nothing in this Order shall prevent the Council by notice, sign or barrier displayed or erected in a parking place:
  - (i) from closing a parking place or any part thereof for any period; and/or
  - (ii) from setting aside a parking place or any part or parts thereof on all days or on certain days or during certain parts of days for use only by particular vehicles or organisations.
- 20. Any person closing or suspending the use of a parking place or any part thereof shall thereupon place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that parking place or that part thereof a notice or traffic sign indicating that of that parking place or that part thereof is closed or the use is suspended and that parking by vehicles is prohibited.

### No parking in suspended parking place

21. No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be parked in a parking place, or any part thereof, during such periods that the parking place or that part thereof is closed or the use is suspended or during such period as there is in or adjacent thereto a notice or traffic sign indicating the closure or suspension placed by or on behalf of the Council.

### Sale of Goods

22. No person shall in a parking place without the express written permission of the Council, use a vehicle, in connection with the sale of any article, including

the vehicle itself, to any person in or near the parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of skill or services in any other capacity.

### Parked with engine running

23. No person shall in a parking place continue to run the engine when the vehicle is in the parking space and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the parking place.

### Sounding horn while parked

24. No person shall while parked in a parking place sound any horn or any other similar instrument on a vehicle.

### Parked causing an obstruction

25. No person shall in a parking place park the vehicle in such a manner or place where it causes an obstruction to any other users of the parking place.

### Use of vehicle

26. No person shall use any vehicle parked in a parking place for sleeping or camping or cooking purposes.

### Maintaining or washing a vehicle

27. No person shall carry out any actions of maintenance service or washing of any vehicle or part thereof other than is reasonably necessary to enable the vehicle to depart from the parking place.

### Trailers and transporters

- 28. No person shall cause or permit a vehicle drawing a trailer to be parked in any parking place specified as available for trailer parking unless such vehicle and trailer have been disconnected, and for the purposes of this Order the vehicle and the trailer shall be deemed to be separate vehicles and the trailer shall be subject to the same conditions and stipulations as a vehicle.
- 29. No trailer or vehicle shall be loaded or unloaded in a parking place.

### PART 3 CHARGES FOR PARKING

### **Payment**

30. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle or trailer to be parked in a parking place without arranging for the appropriate charge (if any) to be paid in accordance with the scale of current charges as specified in the Schedule.

### Means of payment

31. The charges referred to in the preceding Article shall be payable in the manner as advertised at that parking place.

### Pay and display parking places

32. The person in charge of a vehicle or trailer, upon parking the vehicle or trailer in a parking bay, shall immediately ensure that a pay and display ticket is purchased from a ticket machine situated at that parking place at the level of charge and for the period required in accordance with the scale of daily charges as advertised at that parking place.

### Display of ticket

- 33. Once a vehicle or trailer has been parked within a pay and display parking place the person in charge of the vehicle shall ensure:
  - (i) that a valid pay and display ticket has been obtained to cover the entire period that the vehicle or trailer is parked in the parking place, and
  - (ii) that the valid pay and display ticket is displayed in the relevant position on the vehicle or trailer in respect of which it was issued at all times the vehicle is parked.
- 34. For the avoidance of doubt, a trailer will require a ticket separate from any ticket obtained for the vehicle towing it.

### Validity of pay and display tickets

- 35. A pay and display ticket is not transferable from one vehicle or trailer to another and on transfer the pay and display ticket ceases to be valid.
- 36. A pay and display ticket is valid only in the parking place in which it was issued. This is defined by the reference code of the ticket machine located in that parking place printed on the pay and display ticket.

### Expiry of parking period

37. The expiry of the period for which the appropriate charge has been paid shall be where a pay and display ticket has been purchased, when the time shown on the clock of the issuing ticket machine is later than the expiry time shown on the pay and display ticket displayed.

### No pay and display ticket displayed

38. If at any time while a vehicle is parked in a parking place no pay and display ticket is displayed on that vehicle in accordance with the provisions of this order, it shall be deemed that the charge has not been paid.

### Difficulties with ticket machines

- 39. If at the time when a vehicle is parked during the charging hours in a parking place and the nearest ticket machine in that parking place is out of order, then a ticket shall be obtained from another ticket machine within the same parking place (where provided) or as directed in the parking place.
- 40. Where no valid pay and display ticket can be obtained from a ticket machine within a parking place, vehicles may be parked in a parking place but may not be parked for longer than the maximum period of parking in that parking place as specified in the Schedule.

### Season tickets and parking permits

41. Season tickets and parking permits are available from the Council at the appropriate fee, for a vehicle of a specific class and for a specific parking place subject to conditions determined by the Council.

- 42. A season ticket or parking permit is only valid in the parking place(s) in respect of which it was issued, for the vehicle in respect of which it was issued and up to the date of expiry shown on the parking permit.
- 43. The driver shall abide by the terms stipulated by the Council for the use of the season ticket or parking permit.

### Display of season ticket and parking permits

44. A season ticket or parking permit shall be displayed in the relevant position on the vehicle in respect of which it was issued at all times during which the vehicle is parked in the parking place.

### Restriction on removal

45. When a pay and display ticket or season ticket or parking permit has been exhibited on a vehicle in the relevant position no person shall remove the pay and display ticket or season ticket or parking permit from the vehicle until the vehicle is removed from the parking place.

### PART 4 EXEMPTIONS

### Exemption from daily charge

- 46. No daily charge shall be payable in respect of;
  - (i) a vehicle which displays in the relevant position a valid disabled person's badge and a parking disc provided that the vehicle immediately before or after the act of parking has been used or is about to be used by the person(s) in respect of whom the badge is issued;
  - (ii) a vehicle parked displaying in a relevant position a season ticket or parking permit valid for that time and that parking place; or
  - (iii) unless specifically directed in the parking place, a motor cycle correctly parked in the parking place.

### Absence of ticket machine

47. If at the time when a vehicle is parked in a parking place during the charging hours there is no working ticket machine at the parking place, or all the ticket machines at that parking place carry notices placed upon them by a person duly authorised by the Council indicating that they are out of order, the driver of that vehicle shall be exempt from the requirement of purchasing a pay and display ticket.

### PART 5 RELOCATION, REMOVAL AND DISPOSAL OF VEHICLES

### **Emergencies**

48. A person authorised by the Council or a police officer in uniform may, using such measures as are appropriate, move or cause to be moved in the case of an emergency to any place he/she thinks fit, any vehicle parked in a parking place.

### Contraventions in suspended parking place

49. A person authorised by the Council may, using such measures as are appropriate, move or cause to be moved to any place he/she thinks fit, any vehicle parked in a parking place which has been closed or suspended in whole or in part by the Council and the cost of movement or removal and safe keeping shall be the liability of the owner of the vehicle.

### Safe keeping

50. Any person removing a vehicle from a parking place under the provisions of this Order shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary to provide for the safe keeping of the vehicle.

### Vehicles abandoned in parking places

51. The Council may sell or otherwise dispose of, in accordance with current relevant legislation, a vehicle which has been, or could at any time be, removed from a parking place if the vehicle appears to have been abandoned.

### PART 6 CONTRAVENTION AND PENALTY CHARGE

### Contravention

52. Save for the provisions in Part 7, if a vehicle is parked in a parking place without complying with the requirements of this Order, a contravention shall have occurred and a penalty charge shall be payable.

### Penalty Charge Notice (PCN)

- 53. In the case of a vehicle in respect of which the penalty charge may have been incurred it shall be the duty of a Civil Enforcement Officer to attach to the vehicle in a conspicuous position or hand to the person appearing to be the driver of the vehicle a notice (PCN) which shall include the following:
  - (i) The grounds on which the Civil Enforcement Officer believes that a penalty charge is payable with respect to the vehicle;
  - (ii) The amount of penalty charge which is payable:
  - (iii) That the penalty charge must be paid before the end of the period of 28 days beginning with the date of the Notice;
  - (iv) That if the penalty charge is paid before the end of the period of 14 days beginning with the date of the Notice, the amount of the penalty charge will be reduced by the specified proportion;
  - (v) That if the penalty charge is not paid before the end of the 28 day period a Notice to the owner may be served by the Council on the person appearing to them to be the owner of the vehicle;
  - (vi) The address to which payment of the penalty charge must be sent.

### Payment of Penalty Charge

- 54. If the PCN is paid not later than the last day of the period of 14 days (refers to first 14 days from when the PCN was served) the amount of any applicable discount applies.
- 55. Full payment of the PCN must be received not later than the last day of the period of 28 days, beginning with the date on which the PCN was served.
- 56. If the PCN is not paid before the end of the 28 days, beginning with the date on which the PCN was served, the Council may serve a Notice to the Owner on the registered keeper.
- 57. If the PCN is not paid by the end of the 28 day period, from the date of the Notice to the Owner, the PCN may be increased by 50%.
- 58. Payments can be made by telephone, internet or by sending a cheque or postal order to the Council or by paying in person at the Council's parking shop.

### Restriction on removal of notices

- 59. Any notice fixed to a vehicle in accordance with this Order shall not be removed or interfered with except by or under the authority of:
  - (i) the owner, or person in charge of the vehicle;
  - (ii) the Council for the parking place in which the vehicle in question was found.

Any person removing such a notice shall be liable to prosecution.

### Indications as Evidence

60. The particulars given in any notice served on a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of this Order shall be treated as evidence in any proceedings relating to failure to pay the penalty charge.

### PART 7

### LIABILITY VALIDITY AND OTHER PROVISIONS

### Liability

61. The Council accepts no liability for the loss or damage to vehicles or other property left in any of the parking places to which this Order applies save for that arising from the negligence of the Council.

### **Validity**

62. If a court, the Department for Transport, the Traffic Penalty Tribunal or the Traffic Enforcement Centre declares any part of this Order to be invalid or unenforceable, such declaration shall not invalidate the remainder of the Order.

### Unlicensed Vehicles in Parking Places

- 63. The driver of any vehicle shall not permit it to wait in a parking place unless:
  - the vehicle is licensed in accordance with the provisions
     of Section 1 of the Vehicles (Excise) Act 1971; and
  - 2. the vehicle excise license is displayed on the vehicle; and
    - 3. there is in existence in relation to the use of the vehicle by the driver such a policy of insurance as complies with the requirements of Part VI of the Road Traffic Act 1988 or any Act amending or replacing the same for the time being in force.

### Driving within a parking place

- 64. Where in a parking place signs are erected or surface markings are laid for the purpose of
  - (i) indicating the entrance to or exit from the parking place, or
  - (ii) indicating that a vehicle using the parking place shall proceed in a specified direction within the parking place,

any person who drives or permits to be driven any vehicle

(i) so that it enters the parking place otherwise than by an entrance or leaves the parking place otherwise than by an exit, so indicated, or

- (ii) in a direction other than so specified shall be liable to prosecution.
- 65. Any person who, without with the permission of a person authorised by the Council in that behalf, drives or permits to be driven any vehicle in a parking place for any purpose other than the purpose of leaving that vehicle in the parking place in accordance with the provisions of this Order or for the purpose of departing from the parking place shall be liable to prosecution.

### Wilful damage

- 66. Any person who with intent to defraud interferes with a ticket machine or operates or attempts to operate it by the insertion of objects other than undamaged and unaltered coins of legal tender and of the appropriate denomination, shall be liable to prosecution.
- 67. Any person, who causes damage to any signing, or lighting installations within the parking place or to any part of the fabric of the parking place, shall be liable to prosecution.

### Behaviour

- 68. Any person who wilfully sounds any horn or any other similar instrument on a vehicle except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the parking place shall be liable to prosecution.
- 69. Any person who in a parking place shouts or otherwise makes any loud noise to the disturbance or annoyance of users of the parking place or residents or occupiers of premises in the neighbourhood shall be liable to prosecution.
- 70. Any person who in a parking place uses any threatening, abusive or insulting language, gesture or conduct with intent to put any person in fear or so as to occasion a breach of the peace or whereby a breach of the peace is likely to be occasioned shall be liable to prosecution.

### Skateboarding

71. Any person who in a parking place undertakes activities such as roller-skating, skate boarding, go-carting, the use of mini-motorbikes, quad bikes or any other similar vehicles to the disturbance or annoyance of users of the parking place or residents or occupants of premises in the neighbourhood shall be liable to prosecution.

### Other activities

- 72. Any person who in a parking place
  - (i) erects or causes or permits to be erected any tent, booth, stand,building or other structure without the written consent of the Council, or
  - (ii) lights or causes to be lit any fire, shall be liable to prosecution.

### PART 8

### REVOCATIONS

### Revocations

73. The following Order made by Adur District Council and all their Amendments and any other Orders and Regulations of whatever nature relating to off-street parking places specified in the Schedules within the area of the Council made before the introduction of this Order are hereby revoked:
