ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967

WILTSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS, DOWNTON)

(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER, 1979

The Wiltshire County Council in exercise of their powers under Section 1(1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act, 1972, and Schedule 6 of the Road Traffic Act, 1974, and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Section 84C(1) of the said Act of 1967, hereby make the following Order:-

1. Save as provided in Articles 2, 3 and 4 of this Order, no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on any of the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.
2. Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on any of the lengths of road referred to in that Article, for so long as may be necessary:-
 - (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle;
 - (c) to enable the vehicle, if it is in the service of or employed by the Post Office, to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of The Post Office Act, 1953;
 - (d) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the road so referred to or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near the said road of any sewer or of any main, pipe, or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act, 1878; or
 - (e) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.
3. Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall apply to any vehicle owned by a funeral director or owner of funeral vehicles when in use as part of a funeral cortege or otherwise in connection with a funeral.
4. Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in any road or part of a road referred to for a period not exceeding two hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from the previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same road or part of a road).

5. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restrictions or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended as aforesaid or by or under any other enactment.
6. In Article (4) the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:-

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations, 1975;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badge for Motor Vehicles) Regulations, 1975;

"parking disc" means a disc, issued by a local authority, complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specifications for Parking Discs (BS No. 4631: 19700 coloured orange, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins; and

"relevant position" means

- (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen;
 - (ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the vehicle.
7. This Order shall come into operation on the 17th March, 1980, and may be cited as "The County of Wiltshire (Various Roads, Downton) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1979."

SCHEDULE

Lengths of road in the Parish of Downton in the District of Salisbury

A.338 The Headlands

- East side -
- (i) From a point 15 metres north of its junction with Long Close southwards to a point 15 metres south of that junction.
 - (ii) From a point 70 metres north of its junction with the B.3080 (The Borough) southwards to a point 95 metres south of that junction.
- West side -
- From a point 22 metres north of its junction with Wick Lane southwards to a point 55 metres south of that junction.

A.338 The Headlands (contd.)

- East side - From a point 38 metres north of the junction with the B.3080 southwards to a point 62 metres south of its junction with Marie Avenue.

B.3080 The Borough

- North side - From its junction with The Headlands for a distance of 32 metres in an easterly direction.

- South side - From its junction with The Headlands for a distance of 62 metres in an easterly direction.

B.3080 The Borough/High Street

- North side - From a point 50 metres east of the centre of The Iron Bridge to a point 86 metres west of the centre of that bridge.

- South side - From a point 30 metres east of the centre of The Iron Bridge to a point 60 metres west of the centre of that bridge.

Wick Lane

- North side - From its junction with The Headlands (A.338) for a distance of 35 metres in a westerly direction.

- South side - From its junction with The Headlands (A.338) for a distance of 15 metres in a westerly direction.


Long Close

- Both sides - From its junction with The Headlands (A.338) for a distance of 30 metres in an easterly direction.

Marie Avenue

- Both sides - From its junction with The Headlands (A.338) for a distance of 10 metres in a westerly direction.
