ROAD TRAFFIC

THE A36 TRUNK ROAD (SOUTHAMPTON ROAD, SALISBURY, WILTSHIRE)

(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 1987

Made 1st July 1987

Coming into force 7th July 1987

The Secretary Of State for Transport, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) and (2), and 4(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other enabling powers, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A36 Trunk Road (Southampton Road, Salisbury, Wiltshire)(Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1987 and shall come into force on 7th July 1987.

2. (1) In this Order -

"public service vehicle" means a public service vehicle being used in the provision of a service which is or is not a local service under section 2 of the Transport Act 1985 (b);

"authorised bus stop" means an area of carriageway in the length of trunk road which is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with diagram 1025.1 or 1025.3 in Schedule 2 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 1981 (c);

"parking disc" means a disc, issued by a local authority, complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specifications for Parking Discs (BS No. 4631; 1970), but coloured orange, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins; and

"the length of trunk road" means the West of Southampton-Bath Trunk Road (A36), at Salisbury in the District of Salisbury in the County of Wiltshire, between a point 100 metres east of the centre line of its junction with Tollgate Road and its junction with Churchill Way roundabout.

(2) For the purposes of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying -

(a) a disabled person's badge in the relevant position, when -

(i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forward on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen; and

(ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or nearside of the vehicle; and

(b) a parking disc in the relevant position, when the disc is exhibited thereon with the side which shows the time facing forwards or outwards, and immediately behind the windscreen or side window nearest to the kerb.

(3) Except where otherwise stated any reference in this Order to a numbered article or schedule is a reference to the article in or schedule to this Order which bears that number.

3. Save as provided in article 4 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in the length of trunk road.

4. (1) Nothing in article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the length of trunk road for so long as may be necessary to enable -

(a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;

(b) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely -

(i) building, industrial or demolition operations;

(ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;

(iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of that length; or

(iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or on land adjacent to, that length of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunication apparatus as defined in schedule 2 to the Telecommunications Act 1984(a).

(c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority;

(d) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953(b); or

(a) 1984 c.12.

(e) the vehicle to be used for police, ambulance, or fire brigade purposes;

(2) Nothing in article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the length of trunk road for so long as may be necessary for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded or unloaded from the vehicle.

(3) Nothing in article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled persons vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled persons badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in the length of trunk road for a period not exceeding two hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting on the same side of road).

(4) Nothing in article 3 shall render it unlawful for a public service vehicle to wait on an authorised bus stop.
