ROAD TRAFFIC
THE A36 TRUNK ROAD (WILTON ROAD, SALISBURY, WILTSHIRE)
(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 1990

Made 20th December 1990
Coming into force 21st December 1990

The Secretary of State for Transport, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) and (2) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (a), and of all other enabling powers, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A36 Trunk Road (Wilton Road, Salisbury, Wiltshire) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1990 and shall come into force on 21st December 1990.

2. (1) In this Order:-

'parking disc' means a disc, issued by a local authority, complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specification for Parking Discs (BS No 4631; 1970), but coloured orange, and capable, of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins;

'the trunk road' means the A36 Trunk Road in the District of Salisbury in the County of Wiltshire; and

'a water authority' means a water or sewerage undertaker within the meaning of the Water Act 1989 (b).

(2) In this Order, a reference to the side of road specified in the Schedule is a reference to the length of the side of the road so specified.

(3) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displayed:-

(a) a disabled person's badge in the relevant position, when:-

(i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forward on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen, and

(ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or nearside of the vehicle; and

(b) a parking disc in the relevant position, when the disc is exhibited thereon with the side which shows the time facing forwards or outwards, and immediately behind the windscreen or side window nearest to the kerb.



(4) Except where otherwise stated, a reference in this Order to a numbered article is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number, and a reference to the Schedule is a reference to the Schedule to this Order.

3. Save as provided in article 4 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the side of road specified in the Schedule.

4. (1) Nothing in article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the side of road referred to therein, for so long as may be necessary to enable:-

(a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;

(b) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:-

(i) building, industrial or demolition operations;

(ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;

(iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of that side of road; or

(iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or on land adjacent to, that side of road of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any apparatus as defined in schedule 2 to the Telecommunications Act 1984(a);

(c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority;

(d) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953(b);

(e) the vehicle to be used for police, ambulance or fire brigade purposes; or

(f) a person to load on or unload from the vehicle personal luggage.

(2) Nothing in article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded or unloaded from the vehicle at any time on any day on the side of road specified in the Schedule.



(3) Nothing in article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled persons vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled persons badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on the side of road referred to in that article for a period not exceeding two hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting on the same side of the road).

THE SCHEDULE

Side of road in Salisbury

Wilton Road (South Side)

From a point 13 metres west of the centreline of its junction with Gramshaw Road to a point 18 metres east of the centreline of that junction.
