

WILTSHIRE COUNTY COUNCILROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984Wiltshire County Council (Salisbury) (St. Edmund's Area)
(Residents' Parking Places) Order 1989
(Amendment No. 2) Order 1992

The Wiltshire County Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of their powers under Sections 45, 46, 49 and 53 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order:-

1. The Wiltshire County Council (Salisbury) (St. Edmund's Area) (Residents' Parking Places) Order 1989 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order of 1989") shall be further amended by:-
 - i) The addition to Schedule 1 of the Order of 1989 of the lengths of road specified in Schedule 1 to this Order.
 - ii) The addition to Schedule 2 of the Order of 1989 of the Street names specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.
2. The Order of 1989 shall be further amended by the following:-
 - (1) After the definition of "business resident" in Article 2(1) of the Order 1989 there shall be inserted:-

"'household' means a collective group of related domestic residents whose usual residence is at one dwelling the address of which or the flank frontage of which is in any street or part of a street described in Schedule 2 to this Order."
 - (2) After Article 6(1) there shall be inserted:-

"6(1)A Any domestic resident over sixty years of age living in a household to whom no permit has been issued may apply to the Council for the issue of a visitor's permit for use on any passenger vehicle, dual purpose vehicle, goods vehicle or motor cycle belonging to any visitor to the household for the leaving in a designated parking place of that vehicle and any such application shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the Council and shall include the information required by such form."
 - (3) Article 6(3) shall be substituted by the following:-

"6(3) On receipt of an application made under the foregoing provisions of this Article, the Council, upon being satisfied that the applicant is:-

 - (a) a domestic resident or a business resident and is the owner of a vehicle of the class specified in paragraph (1) of this Article shall issue to that applicant

one permit for the leaving during the permitted hours in a parking space in any parking place of the vehicle to which such permit relates by the owner of such vehicle or by any person using such vehicle with the consent of the owner other than a person to whom such vehicle has been let for hire or reward, or

- (b) a domestic resident over sixty years of age and is living in a household to whom no permit has been issued, shall issue to that applicant one visitor's permit for use by any visitor to that household for the leaving during the permitted hours in a parking space in a parking place of a vehicle of a class specified in paragraph (2) of this Article.

Provided that, subject to the provisions of Article 8 of this Order the Council shall not issue any permit to a resident which would be valid for any period during which any other permit issued to that resident extends."

- (4) After Article 7(3)(e) there shall be inserted:-

"7(3)(f) a visitor permit shall cease to be valid and must be surrendered at the time an application is made for a resident's permit by any member of the visitor permit holder's household."

- (5) Article 9(A) shall be substituted by the following:-

"9(A) For a Domestic Resident's Permit

- (a) the permit number.
- (b) an indication of the zone for which the permit has been issued.
- (c) the registration mark of the vehicle in respect of which the permit has been issued.
- (d) the period during which, subject to Article 7(4) of this Order, the permit shall remain valid.
- (e) an authentication that the permit has been issued by the Council.

- (6) After Article 9(B) there shall be inserted:-

"9(C) For a Visitor's Permit

- (a) the permit number.
- (b) an indication of the zone for which the permit has been issued.
- (c) the address of the householder.

- (d) the period during which, subject to Article 7(4) of this Order, the permit shall remain valid.
- (e) an authentication that the permit has been issued by the Council."

3. This Order shall come into operation on 16th March, 1992 and may be cited as the Wiltshire County Council (Salisbury) (St. Edmund's Area) (Residents' Parking Places) Order 1989 (Amendment No. 2) Order 1992.

Schedule 1

Additions to Schedule 1 of the Order of 1989
(Area of Highway designated as parking places with permits)

<u>Road</u>	<u>Side</u>	<u>Description</u>
Endless Street	East Side	From a point 30m north of its junction with Bedwin Street to a point 28m south of its junction with Belle Vue Road.
Nelson Road	Both	From a point 20m north east of its western end to its eastern end.
