ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

THE A36 TRUNK ROAD (WILTSHIRE)

(24 HOURS CLEARWAY) ORDER 2003

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he made this Order in part, by virtue of Regulation 21 of the Secretary of State's Traffic Orders (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1990. The Order, on the A36 Trunk Road in the District of West Wiltshire and Salisbury in the County of Wiltshire, was made on 4 April 2003 and will come into force on 30 June 2003.

This Order as made gives effect to the remaining provisions of the Order as originally proposed, subject to modifications. The previous Order, the A36 Trunk Road (Wiltshire) (24 Hours Clearway Order) 2002 [SI No 2002/1051], was made on 8 April 2002.

The notice of the proposal to make the original Order (reference MSE 5079/A36/0/07/22/1) was published in issue number 55957 of the London Gazette on 31 August 2000. The original Order was made in part. The notice of the making of that part of the Order, (reference MSE 5079/A36/0/07/22/1) was published in issue 56533 of the London Gazette on 11 April 2002.

The effect of this Order is as described in the notice of the proposal, except that:

the Secretary of State has modified the Order to exclude Eastclyffe layby from its provisions, which would prohibit the selling or dispensing of goods from, or in, a vehicle waiting on any part of the trunk road, slip roads or laybys on the length of trunk road previously described, and

he has modified the Order to allow the enforcement of its provisions in Salisbury District by Parking Attendants following the designation of Salisbury District as a Special Parking/Permitted Parking Area.

A copy of the made Order and of a plan illustrating the proposal may be inspected during office hours at Salisbury District Council, The Council House, Bourne Hill, Salisbury, Wiltshire; Salisbury Public Library, The Market Place, Salisbury, Wiltshire; and during opening hours at Warminster Post Office, 6-10 The Mall, Warminster, Wiltshire; and West Wellow Post Office, Salisbury Road, West Wellow, Romsey. They may also be obtained by application to the Highways Agency,

Any person aggrieved by the Order and wishing to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the above Act, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act, or of regulations made thereunder, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within six weeks from 4 April 2003, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or any provisions contained therein.

**THE A36 TRUNK ROAD (WILTSHIRE) (24 HOURS CLEARWAY)
ORDER 2003**

Made 4 April 2003

Coming into force 30 June 2003

The Secretary of State for Transport, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 1 (1), 2 (1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (a) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A36 Trunk Road (Wiltshire) (24 Hours Clearway) Order 2003 and shall come into force on 30 June 2003.
2. In this Order:

"the trunk road"

means the A36 Trunk Road in the Districts of West Wiltshire and Salisbury, in the County of Wiltshire from

(a) the point where it crosses the Wiltshire/Somerset County boundary, 50 metres south east of the access to Maidsgrove Farm, Standerwick, Somerset, to a point 110 metres west of the access to 'Hunters Lodge', west of Stapleford, and

(b) a point 50 metres east of the centre of its junction with the C324 to Alderbury at the western end of the Alderbury Bypass to a point 260 metres east of the centre of its junction with the B3079 Lyndhurst Road at Landford;

"a slip road"

means any slip road leading to or from the trunk road;

"a connecting road"

means any road connecting the trunk road with the A303 Trunk Road at the Deptford/Wyllye interchange;

"a road"

means the trunk road, a slip road or a connecting road;

"carriageway"

means a way consisting of, or comprised in a road being a way (other than a cycle track) over which the public have a right of way for the passage of vehicles;

"verge"

means any part of a road that is not a carriageway.

"layby"

means any area of carriageway intended for the waiting of vehicles and bounded partly by a traffic sign of the type shown in diagram 1010 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002 (a) and partly by the outer edge of the carriageway on the same side of the road as the traffic sign;

"Eastclyffe layby"

means the layby situated on the south side of the trunk road at Eastclyffe, east of Steeple Langford, approximately 570 metres west of Southington Farm access, running in a generally westward direction for a distance of 180 metres.



3. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait on any part of any verge or carriageway of a road, except in Eastclyffe layby, for the purpose of selling or dispensing of goods from or in that vehicle, unless the goods are immediately delivered at, or taken into, premises adjacent to the land on which the vehicle stood when the goods were sold or dispensed.
4. The following article applies to the part of the trunk road which is situated within the area of Salisbury District Council:
 - (a) Where a vehicle has been left in contravention of the waiting restrictions imposed by this Order, a Penalty Charge shall be incurred, the amount of which will be set by Wiltshire County Council under the provisions of the Road Traffic Act 1991 relating to special parking areas and permitted parking areas.
 - (b) Where a Penalty Charge is payable, a Penalty Notice shall be issued by a Parking Attendant in accordance with the requirements of Schedule 3 of the Act of 1991.
 - (c) The Penalty Charge Notice shall be paid within 28 days payable to Salisbury District Council under the terms referred to in the said Notice.
