### THE COUNTY OF WILTSHIRE (CENTRAL SALISBURY) (PAY AND DISPLAY STREET PARKING PLACES) ORDER 2004

The Council of the County of Wiltshire in exercise of its powers under Sections 45, 46, 49, 51, 53, 63A and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") as amended and the Road Traffic Act 1991, as amended (whether generally or in relation to the Council's area or part thereof) (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1991") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order.

#### PART I – GENERAL

#### Interpretation

1. In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:-

"driver", in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place, means a person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place

"waiver document" means a document issued by Salisbury District Council to either a resident, business or visitor to exempt a vehicle from waiting where a restriction applies or from a time limit or a pay and display charge under the terms and charges applicable at the time of issue

"permit" in relation to Article 27 means a document issued by Salisbury District Council to either a resident or visitor of Zone A under the terms and charges applicable at the time of issue and the restrictions applying under the Wiltshire County Council (Salisbury) (St. Edmund's Area) (Residents' Parking Places) Order 1989 (as amended)

"the Council" means during any period in which there is in force an agreement under Section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 between the Wiltshire County Council and the Salisbury District Council that the District Council shall administer the Order on the County Council's behalf, the Salisbury District Council failing which it shall mean the Wiltshire County Council

"Parking Attendant" has the meaning given by Section 63A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984

"motor cycle" has the same meaning as defined in Section 136(4) of the Act

"Parking Place" means the part of a road authorised by this Order to be used as a parking area

"disabled person's vehicle" means a vehicle lawfully displaying a disabled person's badge

"disabled person's badge" means a badge issued by a local authority in the form prescribed by Regulations 7 and 11 of The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000

"parking disc" means a device which -

- (a) is 125 millimetres square and coloured blue;
- (b) has been issued by a local authority and has not ceased to be valid; and
- (c) is capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting has begun.

"relevant position" means:-

- (1) A vehicle displays a disabled persons' badge in the relevant position if:
- (a) the badge is exhibited on the dashboard or facia of the vehicle; or
- (b) where the vehicle is not fitted with a dashboard or facia, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle

so that the front of the badge is clearly legible from outside the vehicle.

- (2) A vehicle displays a parking disc in the relevant position if:
- (a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the disc is exhibited thereon so that the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle; or
- (b) in the case of a vehicle not so fitted, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the quarter-hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle.

"pay and display machine" means apparatus designed to indicate the time by a clock and to issue tickets indicating:

- (a) the date of issue;
- (b) the payment of a charge;
- (c) the departure time; and
- (d) the parking place

"charging hours" means the hours during which a charge is made as specified in Column D in the Schedules to this Order

"pay and display charge" means the charge for the period paid for a parking ticket as specified in Column D in the Schedules to this Order

- 2. The County of Wiltshire (Central Salisbury) (Pay and Display Street Parking Places) Order 2003 is hereby revoked.
- 3. This Order shall come into operation on 24 May 2004 and may be cited as The County of Wiltshire (Central Salisbury) (Pay and Display Street Parking Places) Order 2004.

#### **PART II**

#### **AUTHORISATION AND USE OF PARKING PLACES**

- 4. Each of the parts of a road specified in Schedules 1, 2 and 3 to this Order are authorised to be used, subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a parking place for such vehicles or classes of vehicle on such days, during such hours, with such charges as are specified in relation to those Schedules.
- 5. The limits of each parking place and the limits of any parking bay shall be indicated by the Council on the carriageway by the appropriate traffic signs.
- 6. Except as provided in Articles 27 and 28 to this Order when a vehicle has been left in a parking place specified in Schedules 1, 2 and 3 to this Order during the charging hours the driver thereof shall pay such charge or charges as specified in Column D in those Schedules.

### Method of Payment of Pay and Display Charge

- 7. The pay and display charge specified in Column D of Schedules 1, 2 and 3 to this Order shall be payable on arrival at a parking place:
  - a) by the insertion in a pay and display machine relating to any parking place in which the vehicle is left of a coin of the denomination of one pound; fifty pence; twenty pence; ten pence, five pence or of coins of any or of all these denominations together making up the amount of the pay and display charge for the period for which payment is being made;
  - b) where the facility is provided, by the insertion in a pay and display machine relating to any parking place in which the vehicle is left of a credit card or debit card, or
  - c) where the facility is provided, by the insertion in a pay and display machine relating to any parking place in which the vehicle is left, by means of an electronic smart card issued by the Council.

#### Requirement to exhibit tickets

8. Upon payment of the pay and display charge the driver shall exhibit on the vehicle, in accordance with the provisions of Article 9 of this Order, a ticket issued by a pay and display machine relating to the parking place in which the vehicle is left.

#### Where the ticket is to be exhibited

- 9. At all times during which a vehicle is left in a parking place referred to in Schedules 1, 2 and 3 to this Order during the charging hours, the ticket referred to in Article 8 of this Order shall be exhibited on the vehicle:-
- (a) where the vehicle is fitted with a front glass windscreen extending across the vehicle to the near side, facing forwards in a position so as to be clearly visible behind the near side of the glass of such windscreen; or
- (b) where the vehicle is not fitted with a front glass windscreen as specified in item (a) of this Article, on or within the vehicle so that the ticket is clearly visible to a person standing at the near side of the vehicle.

#### **Restriction on Removal of Ticket**

10. When a pay and display machine ticket has been exhibited on a vehicle in accordance with Article 9 of this Order, no person, not being the driver of the vehicle shall remove the ticket from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the driver.

#### Pay and Display Machines to be installed at Pay and Display Parking Places

11. There shall be a pay and display machine on or in the vicinity of each pay and display parking place as indicated by appropriate direction signing.

#### **Indications by Pay and Display Tickets**

#### 12. Payment of Pay and Display Charge

(1) Payment of the pay and display charge for a vehicle left in a parking place specified in Column D of Schedules 1, 2 and 3 to this Order during the charging hours shall be indicated by a ticket indicating the date of the pay and display charge, the pay and display charge for which payment was made and the departure time, being the time at which the said ticket was issued plus the period for which payment was made by such pay and display charge as is specified in Article 7 of this Order and by exhibition of that ticket on the vehicle in the manner specified in Article 9 of this Order.

#### (2) Expiry of Pay and Display Charge Period

The expiry of the period for which the pay and display charge has been paid shall be indicated when there is exhibited on the vehicle a ticket issued by a pay and display machine relating to any parking place in which the vehicle is left showing the date and time of payment of the charge and the departure time and the time shown on the clock on the said machine is later than the aforementioned departure time.

### Indications by Pay and Display Machines and Tickets As Evidence

#### 13. If No Ticket is Exhibited

- (1) If at any time while a vehicle is left in a parking place during the charging hours no ticket is exhibited on that vehicle in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1) of the last preceding Article it shall be presumed unless the contrary is proved that the pay and display charge has not been duly paid.
- (2) If at any time while a vehicle is left in a parking place during the charging hours the clock on a pay and display machine relating to any parking place in which the vehicle is left and the ticket exhibited on the vehicle gives the indication mentioned in paragraph (2) of the last preceding Article, it shall be presumed unless the contrary is proved that the pay and display charge has been duly paid and that the period for which the pay and display charge was made has already expired.

### No additional Coins or Other Means of Payment To Be Inserted After Payment of Pay and Display Charge

14. No person shall insert in a pay and display machine relating to any parking place in which a vehicle is left, any additional payment by whatever means to the pay and display charge in respect of that vehicle to extend the stay.

#### **Manner of Standing in Parking Places**

- 15. Where in the Schedules to this Order a parking place is described as available for vehicles of a specified class the driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that parking place:
  - (a) unless it is of the specified class;
  - (b) in a position other than that specified.

#### Alteration of Position of Vehicles in Parking Places

16. Where any vehicle is left in the parking place in contravention of any of the provisions contained in Articles 15, 19(5) and 22 to this Order, a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from that parking place provided that when a vehicle is waiting in the parking place in contravention of the provisions of Article 15(b) of this Order, a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with that provision.

#### Removal of Vehicles from Parking Places

17. Any person removing a vehicle or altering its position by virtue of the last preceding Article of this Order may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as he may think necessary and may take such measures in relation to the vehicle as he may think necessary to enable him to remove it or alter its position as the case may be.

18. When a person authorised by the Council removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle from a parking place by virtue of Article 17 of this Order, he shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle.

#### Power to Suspend Use of Parking Places

- 19. (1) Any person duly authorised by the Council may suspend the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever the Council considers such suspension reasonably necessary:-
  - (a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety;
  - (b) for the purpose of any building operation, demolition or excavation in or adjacent to the parking place or the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the parking place or the laying, erection, alteration, removal or repair in or adjacent to the parking place of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in Schedule 2 of the Telecommunications Act 1984 or the placing, maintenance or removal of any traffic sign or pay and display machine;
  - (c) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture from one office or dwelling house to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository;
  - (d) on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any street will be throughd or obstructed; or
  - (e) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place at times of weddings or funerals, or on other special occasions.
  - (2) A Police Officer in uniform may suspend for not longer than twenty-four hours the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety.

#### **Duties of Person Suspending Parking Place**

- (3) Any person suspending the use of a parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1) or paragraph (2) of this Article shall thereupon:
  - in the case of parking places within which the use of all of the parking places relating to one pay and display machine has been suspended, place or cause to be placed over the pay and display machine(s) relating to those parking places a hood or other cover indicating that the use of the places is suspended and that waiting by vehicles is prohibited; and

- (b) in the case of a parking place the use of any part or parts of which, including a parking bay or not, has been suspended, place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that part or those parts a traffic sign indicating that waiting by vehicles is prohibited.
- (4) On any suspension of the use of a parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article, if the use of all the parking places relating to one pay and display machine has been suspended, any person generally or specially authorised by the Council may temporarily remove that pay and display machine and any post, bracket or other support on which such pay and display machine is fitted.
- No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be left in any part of a parking place during such period as either there is a hood or cover indicating that the use of the parking place is suspended in pursuance of paragraph 3(a) of this Article or there is in or adjacent to that part of a parking place a traffic sign placed in pursuance of paragraph (3)(b) of this Article:-

Provided that nothing in this paragraph shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to be left in a car parking place if it is being used:

- (a) for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes, or by a local authority or its agents in pursuance of its statutory powers and duties to maintain the highway;
- (b) the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident;
- (c) in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
- (d) for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953; or
- (e) in connection with the servicing of telephone kiosks or other street furniture adjacent to the parking place;
- (f) or if the vehicle is left with the permission of the person suspending the use of the parking place, a Police officer in uniform or a Parking Attendant.

#### Restriction on Use of Vehicles in Parking Places

20. No person shall use the vehicle while it is in the parking place, in connection with the sale of any article to persons in or near the parking place, or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of his skill or services provided that nothing in this Article shall prevent the sale of goods from a vehicle if the vehicle is a passenger vehicle, a dual purpose vehicle, a goods vehicle or a motor cycle (or an invalid carriage) and the goods are immediately delivered at or taken into premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected.

- 21. The driver of a motor vehicle using the parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in a position in the parking place and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle or to depart from the parking place.
- 22. (1) The driver of a vehicle shall not park in a parking place:-
  - (a) so as unreasonably to prevent access to any premises adjoining the road, or the use of the road by other persons, or so as to be a nuisance;
  - (b) when for preventing obstruction of the parking place the Council shall, by resolution made on the occasion of any public procession, rejoicing or illumination or when the parking place is thronged, or liable to be obstructed, have closed that parking place and exhibited notice of such closing on or near the parking place.
- 23. (1) The driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in a parking place for longer than the maximum period permitted for waiting specified in the Schedules to this Order in relation to that parking place;
  - (2) When a vehicle has left a parking place after waiting thereon the driver thereof shall not within the times specified in the Schedules to this Order after its leaving permit it to wait again upon that parking place.

#### Restriction of Waiting of Vehicles in Parking Places

- 24. Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions of this Order with respect to vehicles which are left in a parking place in accordance with those provisions, any vehicle may wait during the charging hours anywhere on the carriageway in a parking place, other than a parking place or part of a parking place the use of which has been suspended, if:-
  - (a) the vehicle is a vehicle being used in the service of the Police Authority, Fire Brigade or Ambulance Service in the case of emergency; or
  - (b) the vehicle is being used in the service of the local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
  - (c) the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident;
  - (d) the vehicle is waiting only for so long as is necessary to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
  - (e) the vehicle is waiting for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953; or
  - (f) the vehicle not being a passenger vehicle is waiting only for so long as may be reasonably necessary to enable it to be used for the purpose of any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the

maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the road so referred to or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near the said road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in Schedule 2 of the Telecommunications Act 1984, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road;

- (g) the vehicle not being a passenger vehicle is in actual use in connection with the removal of furniture from one office or dwellinghouse to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository;
- (h) the vehicle is waiting at or near any premises situated on or adjacent to the said side or any of the said lengths of road for so long as such waiting by that vehicle is reasonably necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral.
- (2) Except as provided by this Order, the driver of a vehicle shall not cause or permit the vehicle to wait in a parking place during the charging hours.
- (3) Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this Article shall be taken as authorising anything which would be a contravention of any regulations made or having effect as if made under Section 25 of the Act.

#### **Exemption From Time Limit**

- 25 (1) The driver of a vehicle displaying at its front or nearside:
  - (a) a waiver document issued by Salisbury District Council; or
  - (b) a British Medical Association badge or other evidence of a medical visit by the local Health Authority personnel, approved by the Salisbury District Council and the visit is for treatment of a patient living nearby

shall be exempt from any limitation on time specified in the Schedules to this Order when left in a parking place.

26. A disabled driver's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled persons' badge shall be exempt from any limitation on time specified in the Schedules to this Order when left in a parking place.

#### **Exemptions From Pay and Display Charge**

- The driver of a vehicle left in a parking place specified in Schedule 1 to this Order during the charging hours shall be exempt from payment of the pay and display charge if:
  - (i) a valid Zone A permit for the parking place in which the vehicle is left is displayed on the front or nearside of the vehicle;

- (ii) a valid waiver document for the parking place in which the vehicle is left is displayed on the front or nearside of the vehicle; or
- (iii) a disabled persons badge is displayed in the relevant position; or
- (iv) if that vehicle is a motorcycle
- The driver of a vehicle left in a parking place specified in Schedules 2 and 3 to this Order during the charging hours shall be exempt from payment of the pay and display charge if:
  - (i) a valid waiver document for the parking place in which the vehicle is left is displayed on the front or nearside of the vehicle; or
  - (ii) a disabled persons badge is displayed in the relevant position; or
  - (iii) if that vehicle is a motorcycle

#### Out of Order Pay and Display Machines

If at any time during the charging hours a notice is placed on a pay and display machine relating to a parking place indicating that the pay and display machine is out of order, the charge for that parking place shall be suspended unless an alternative meter location is indicated on the pay and display machine and details on such notice shall indicate the nearest alternative parking place.

#### PART III

#### **CONTRAVENTION OF RESTRICTIONS**

- Where a vehicle has been left in contravention of the restrictions imposed by this Order, a Penalty Charge shall be incurred, the amount of which will be set by Wiltshire County Council under the provisions of the Act of 1991 relating to special parking areas and permitted parking areas.
- 31. Where a Penalty Charge is payable, a Penalty Charge Notice shall be issued by a Parking Attendant in accordance with the Act of 1991.
- 32. The Penalty Charge Notice shall be paid within 28 days payable to Salisbury District Council under the terms referred to in the said Notice.

#### **Restriction on Removal of Notices**

33. Where a Penalty Charge Notice has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of the 1991 Act, no person not being the driver of the vehicle, a Police Constable in uniform or a Parking Attendant shall remove the notice from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the driver.

34. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restrictions or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act as amended or by or under any other enactment.
