THE COUNTY OF WILTSHIRE (CENTRAL SALISBURY) (PEDESTRIANISED AREAS)
(PROHIBITION OF WAITING, LOADING AND UNLOADING) ORDER 2004

The Council of the County of Wiltshire in exercise of its powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1) to (2), 4, 63A and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") as amended and the Road Traffic Act 1991, as amended, (whether generally or in relation to the Council's area, or part thereof) (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1991") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order:

1. The following Orders are hereby revoked:-
 - (a) The County of Wiltshire (Queen Street, Salisbury) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting and Loading & Unloading) Order 1997;
 - (b) The County of Wiltshire (High Street and New Street, Salisbury) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting and Loading & Unloading) Order 1997;
 - (c) The County of Wiltshire (Butcher Row and Fish Row, Salisbury) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting and Loading and Unloading) Order 1999.
2. The County of Wiltshire (Salisbury) (One Way) Order 1979 shall be amended by the deletion of item 22 as follows:

Column 1

Lengths of road in the City of Salisbury in the District of Salisbury

Column 2

Direction of Travel

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| 22. New Street: from its junction with the service road providing access to the George Mall Shopping Precinct to its junction with High Street | From the service road providing access to the George Mall Shopping Precinct to High Street. |
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3. Save as provided in Articles 6 and 7 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Parking Attendant cause or permit any vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road specified in Schedule 1 to this Order.

4. Save as provided in Article 6 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Parking Attendant cause or permit any vehicle to load or unload at any time in any of the lengths of road specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.
5. Save as provided in Article 6 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Parking Attendant cause or permit any vehicle to load or unload between the hours of 10.00 am and 4.00 pm on any day in any of the lengths of road specified in Schedule 3 to this Order.
6. Nothing in Articles 3, 4 and 5 of this Order shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to in those Articles for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) a vehicle to be used in the service of the Police, Fire Brigade or Ambulance Service in a case of emergency;
 - (b) a vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of the local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (c) goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from a vehicle provided that no vehicle shall so wait on any of the lengths of road specified:
 - (i) in Schedule 2 to this Order at any time; or
 - (ii) in Schedule 3 to this Order between the hours of 10.00 am and 4.00 pm on any day
 - (d) a vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of any of the lengths of road so referred to or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near to any of the said lengths of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in Schedule 2 of the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - (e) being used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953.
7. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall prevent any person from causing or permitting any vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to in those Articles provided permission has been obtained from Salisbury District Council by means of a formal document to be displayed in the front or nearside of the vehicle which includes information which enables the driver to be contacted in an emergency and providing that an obstruction is not caused by so doing and that

the vehicle is moved if the driver is requested to do so by a Police Officer in uniform or Parking Attendant.

8. Where a vehicle has been left in contravention of the restrictions imposed by this Order, a Penalty Charge shall be incurred, the amount of which will be set by Wiltshire County Council under the provisions of the Act of 1991 relating to special parking areas and permitted parking areas.
9. Where a Penalty Charge is payable, a Penalty Charge Notice shall be issued by a Parking Attendant in accordance with the requirements of the Act of 1991.
10. The Penalty Charge shall be paid within 28 days payable to Salisbury District Council under the terms referred to in the said Notice.
11. The prohibition and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restrictions or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act as amended or by or under any other enactment.
12. In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:-

"Parking Attendant" has the meaning given by Section 63A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;

"formal document" means a document issued by Salisbury District Council to exempt a vehicle from waiting where a restriction applies or from a time limit
13. This Order shall come into operation on 24 May 2004 and shall be cited as The County of Wiltshire (Central Salisbury) (Pedestrianised Areas) (Prohibition of Waiting, Loading and Unloading) Order 2004.

No Loading or Unloading At Any Time

Queen Street	West	The complete length
Queen Street	East	From its junction with Winchester Street to a point 27 metres north of the centreline of the entrance to the Plume of Feathers Yard access to Cross Keys Mall
Queen Street	East	From a point 8 metres north of the centreline of the entrance to the Plume of Feathers Yard access to Cross Keys Mall to a point 21 metres south of that centreline.
Queen Street	East	From its junction with Milford Street to a point 40 metres south of the centreline of the entrance to the Plume of Feathers Yard access to Cross Keys Mall

SCHEDULE 3

No Loading or Unloading Between 10.00 am and 4.00 pm On Any Day

<u>Road</u>	<u>Side</u>	<u>Description</u>
Butcher Row	Both	The complete length
Fish Row	Both	The complete length
High Street	Both	From its junction with New Street to its junction with New Canal
Queen Street	East	From a point 27 metres north of the centreline of the entrance to the Plume of Feathers Yard access to Cross Keys Mall to a point 8 metres north of that centreline.

Queen Street	East	From a point 21 metres south of the centreline of the entrance to the Plume of Feathers Yard access to Cross Keys Mall to a point 40 metres south of that centreline.
