THE WOLVERHAMPTON CITY COUNCIL (WEDNESFIELD) (PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING AND STREET PARKING PLACES) AMENDMENT NO 2 ORDER 2008

Wolverhampton City Council in exercise of its powers under Sections 1, 2, and 124(1)(d) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and of all other enabling powers, after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby make the following Order:-

- 1. This Order shall come into operation on the 11 day of Decuber 2008 and may be cited as The Wolverhampton City Council (Wednesfield) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting and Street Parking Places) Amendment No 2 Order 2008.
- Save as provided in Article 3, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Officer in uniform or of a civil enforcement officer, cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 1 hereto.
- Nothing in Article 2 hereto shall render it unlawful to cause or permit
 any vehicle to wait on the lengths of roads referred to therein for so
 long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely -
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of roads;
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or on land adjacent to the said lengths of roads of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (d) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953;
 - (e) the vehicle to wait at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of roads for so long as such waiting by that vehicle is reasonably necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral;

- the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
 or
- (g) goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle
- (2) Nothing in Article 2 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on the length of road referred to in that Article for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road on the same day).
- No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the length of road specified in Schedule 2 for the purposes of loading and unloading goods from the vehicle.
- No person shall cause or permit any vehicle travelling in the length of road in column 1 of Schedule 3 to proceed in a direction other than that specified in relation to that road in column 2 of the Schedule.

No waiting at any time

Road Name	<u>Side</u>	Definition
1. Well Lane	Both Sides	From its junction with Rookery Street to a point opposite the southern kerbline of Bolton Road
Hall Street and the proposed new east-west arm of Hall Street	Both Sides	From its junction with Well Lane for a distance of 75 metres in a westerly then southerly direction

SCHEDULE 2 No loading at any time

Hall Street and the proposed new east-west arm of Hall Street

Both Sides

From its junction with Well Lane for a distance of 75 metres in a westerly then southerly direction excluding the loading bay on the north side of the proposed east-west arm which lies at a point 34 metres west of Well Lane and extends for a distance of 26 metres in a westerly direction

SCHEDULE 3 One-Way
