<u>THE WOLVERHAMPTON CITY COUNCIL (LONDON PLACE)</u> (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 2007

The Wolverhampton City Council in exercise of its powers under Section 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers, after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order shall come into operation on the ISM day of June and may be cited as the Wolverhampton City Council (London Place) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 2007

GENERAL

2. (1) In this Order -

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in The Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 1975; "parking disc" means a disc, issued by a local authority, complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specification for Parking Discs (BS No 4631:1970), but coloured orange, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins.

- (2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying -
- (a) a disabled person's badge in the relevant position, when -
 - (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen, and
 - (ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the vehicle; and

- (b) a parking disc in the relevant position when the disc is exhibited thereon with the side which shows the time facing forwards or outwards and immediately behind the windscreen or side window nearest to the kerb.
- (3) Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.
- 3. Save as provided in Articles 4 and 5 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform or of a parking attendant cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on any day in the side of road or sides of lengths of roads specified in the Schedule hereto
- 4. Nothing in Article 3 hereto shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the sides of road or sides of lengths of road referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:-
 - (i) goods to be loaded on or unloaded from any vehicle;
 - (ii) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (iii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iv) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of any of the side of road or sides of lengths of roads;
 - (v) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or on the land adjacent to the side of road or sides of lengths of road of any sewer or of any main, pipes or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - (vi) in the service of a local authority or water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;

- (vii) for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953;
- (viii) for fire brigade, police or ambulance purposes
- 5. Nothing in Article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in the road referred to in that Article for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same of length of road on the same day)

SCHEDULE NO WAITING AT ANY TIME

London Place

- a) the west side, the whole length from its junction with Pitt Street including its cul-de-sac end
- b) the east side
- i) from its junction with Pitt Street northward for a distance of 10 metres
- ii) from a point 55 metres north of its junction with Pitt Street northward for a distance of 20 metres
