THE WOLVERHAMPTON CITY COUNCIL (ASHMORE AVENUE AND
GRIFFITHS DRIVE)
(PROHIBITION OF WAITING AND STOPPING OUTSIDE SCHOOLS)
ORDER 2008

Wolverhampton City Council in exercise of its powers under Sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and of all other enabling powers, after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order shall come into operation on the 30th day of May 2008 and may be cited as The Wolverhampton City Council (Ashmore Avenue and Griffiths Drive) (Prohibition of Waiting and Stopping Outside Schools) Order 2008.

2. "disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 2000

"parking disc" means a disc, issued by a Local Authority, in accordance with Article 8(5) of the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000

For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying a disabled person's badge in the relevant position if the badge is displayed in accordance with Part III of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000

"school day" has the same meaning as in Section 579 of the Education Act 1996

3. Save as provided in Article 4, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Officer in uniform or of a parking attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the lengths of roads specified in Schedule I hereto.
4. (1) Nothing in Article 3 hereto shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the lengths of roads referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
- (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely -
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of roads;

- (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or on land adjacent to the said lengths of roads of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (d) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953;
 - (e) the vehicle to wait at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of roads for so long as such waiting by that vehicle is reasonably necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral;
 - (f) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes; or
 - (g) goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle
 - (2) Nothing in Article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on the lengths of roads referred to in that Article for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road on the same day).
5. No person shall cause any vehicle to stop or remain at rest during a school day between 8.00am and 9.30am and between 2.30pm and 4.30pm in any of the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 2 hereto
6. Nothing in Article 5 of this Order shall apply:-
- (a) where the person in control of the vehicle is required by law to stop, or is obliged to do so in order to avoid an accident; or
 - (b) to anything done with the permission of or at the direction of a Police Officer in uniform or a parking attendant;
 - (c) where the vehicle is being used in connection with fire, police or ambulance purposes.

SCHEDULE 1

No waiting at any time

<u>Street</u>	<u>Side of Street</u>	<u>Length of Prohibition</u>
1. Ashmore Avenue	Both Sides	From its junction with its southern section with Griffiths Drive for a distance of 10 metres in a northerly direction From a point 53.56 metres north of its southern section with Griffiths Drive to a point 10 metres north of its junction with Sandy Crescent
2. Griffiths Drive	North Side	From a point 10 metres west of its junction with its southern section of Ashmore Avenue for a distance of 25 metres in an easterly direction

SCHEDULE 2

Prohibition of Stopping Outside School

8.00am - 9.30am and 2.30pm - 4.30pm Monday to Friday

<u>Street</u>	<u>Side of Street</u>	<u>Length of Prohibition</u>
Ashmore Avenue	Both Sides	From a point 10 metres north of its junction with the southern section with Griffiths Drive for a distance of 43.56 metres in a northerly direction
