**WREXHAM COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCIL (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) (OAK ROAD,
WREXHAM INDUSTRIAL ESTATE, WREXHAM) ORDER 2022**

Wrexham County Borough Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of its powers under sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 4(2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as "the 1984 Act") and of all other enabling powers, after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the 1984 Act, hereby makes the following Order.

1 (1) In this Order:-

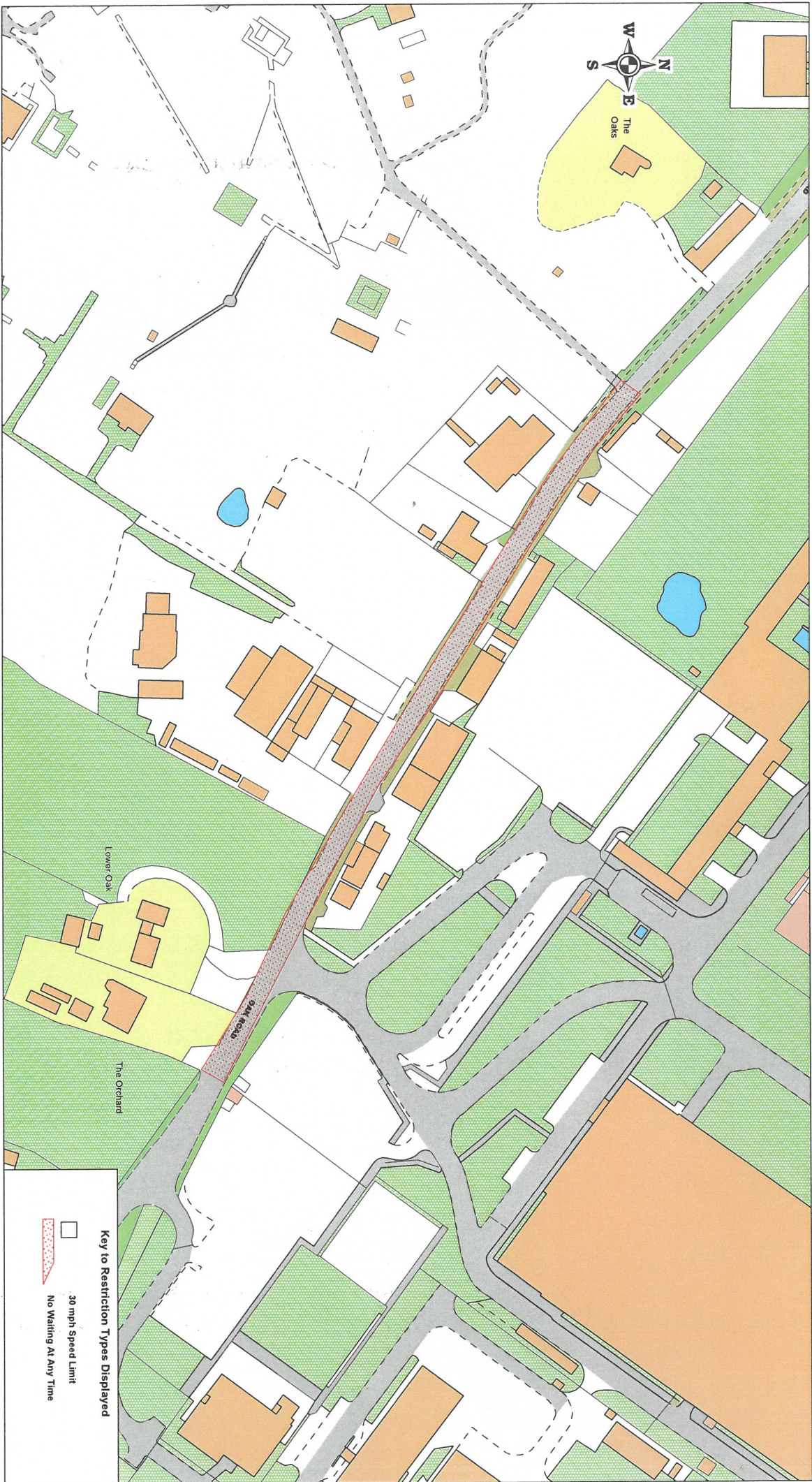
"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Wales) Regulations 2000;

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (Wales) Regulations 2000;

"parking disc" means a disc, 106mm in height and 148mm in width coloured blue if issued on or after 01 July 2000 or 125mm coloured orange if issued before that date; has been issued by a local authority and has not ceased to be valid; and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins;

"authorised hackney carriage stand" means any area of carriageway which is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with diagram 1028.2 in Schedule 6 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 1994;

"authorised parking place" means any parking place on a road authorised or designated by an Order made or having effect as if made under the 1984 Act;

“hackney carriage” has the same meaning as in Section 80(1) of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976.

(2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying:-

(a) a disabled person’s badge in the relevant position if:-

- (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the badge is exhibited thereon so that the front of the badge is clearly legible from outside the vehicle; or
- (ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the front of the badge is clearly legible from outside the vehicle.

(b) a parking disc in the relevant position if:-

- (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the disc is exhibited thereon so that when marked to show the quarter-hour period during which a period of waiting began, that period is clearly legible from outside the vehicle; or
- (ii) in the case of a vehicle not so fitted, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that when marked to show the quarter-hour period during which a period of waiting began, that period is clearly legible from outside the vehicle.

(3) Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article is a reference to the Article bearing that number in this Order.

2. Save as provided in Article 3, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in the length of road specified in the Schedule to this Order as indicated on the plan annexed hereto.
3. (i) Nothing in Article 2 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the length of road specified in the said Schedule referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle;
 - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:-
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said length of road;
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to, the said length of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any line or telecommunication apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984.
 - (d) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or any other Authority in pursuance of statutory powers of duties;

- (e) to enable a Royal Mail liveried vehicle to deliver and/or collect the letter post in pursuance of the universal post service.
 - (f) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes.
- (2) Nothing in Article 2 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in the length of road referred to in that Article for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same day).
- (3) Nothing in Article 2 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle:-
- (a) to wait upon an authorised parking place; or
 - (b) being a hackney carriage, to wait upon an authorised hackney carriage stand.
- (4) The Council is satisfied that, for avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the length of road referred to in Article 2 and for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising, it is requisite that Section 3 (1) of the 1984 Act should not apply to this Order.
- (5) The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulation made or having effect as if made under the 1984 Act or by or under any other enactment.
- (6) This Order shall come into operation on *28 November 2022* and may be cited as The County Borough of Wrexham (Prohibition of Waiting) (Oak Road Wrexham Industrial Estate, Wrexham) Order 2022.
