The County Borough of Wrexham (Various Roads) (City Centre Traffic Regulation Order) Part 1 2025

The County Borough Council of Wrexham (hereinafter referred to as “the Council”) in exercise of its powers under Section 1(1), 2(1) to (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, (which said Act of 1984 is hereinafter referred to as “the Act of 1984”), and of all other enabling powers, hereby makes the following Order:-

Interpretation

In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meaning hereby respectively assigned to them:

“Council” means Wrexham County Borough Council and includes any parking services contractors or authorised agent appointed by or acting on behalf of the Council for the purposes of any function under the provisions of this Order;

“disabled person’s badge” has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Wales) Regulations 2000;

“driver” in relation to a vehicle waiting in a restricted area, means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the restricted waiting area or parking place;

“one-way” means a highway in which the driving of vehicles otherwise than in one direction is prohibited;

“owner” in relation to a vehicle, means the person by whom such vehicle is kept and used. In determining who was the owner at any time it shall be presumed that the owner was the person named in the vehicle registration document as the registered keeper of the vehicle or the person who has the use of such vehicle in the course of his / her employment and who is entitled to use such vehicle as though he / she were the registered keeper thereof;

“civil enforcement officer” shall have the same meaning as in Section 76 of the Traffic Management Act 2004;

“parking disc” has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities’ Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons)(Wales) Regulations 2000 which is capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting has begun;

“parking place” means an area of a highway designated for the waiting of vehicles of specific classes and indicated on a carriageway by markings in accordance with the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016;

“passenger vehicle” means a motor vehicle (other than a motor-cycle or invalid carriage) constructed or adapted solely for the carriage of not more than twelve passengers (exclusive of the driver) and their effects and not drawing a trailer;

“penalty charge” means a charge imposed by legislation in respect of road traffic contraventions that are subject to civil enforcement;

“relevant position” in respect of: -

(a) a disabled person's badge and parking disc has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (Wales) Regulations 2000; and

(b) a permit means exhibited on the windscreen, dashboard or fascia of the vehicle or, where the vehicle does not have a windscreen, dashboard or fascia, in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the whole of the information on the front of the permit is clearly legible from outside the vehicle;

"restricted hours" means in relation to any restricted road the hours during which waiting is restricted;

"restricted road" means any of the sides or lengths of roads where waiting is restricted or specific activities are restricted during the restricted hours provided that the expression "restricted road" shall not include any parking place;

"waiver certificate" means a certificate issued by or on behalf of the Council for the purposes of this Order permitting a specified vehicle to wait in specified circumstances on a length or lengths of road where the waiting of that vehicle would otherwise be restricted or prohibited.

The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament and as if for the purposes of Section 21 of that Act this Order were an Act of Parliament and the Orders revoked by this Order were Acts of Parliament thereby repealed.

One Way

1. No person shall, except upon the direction of with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any motor vehicle to proceed in the length of road specified in column 1 of Schedule 1 to this Order in a direction other than that specified in relation to that length of road, as the case may be, in column 2 of the said Schedule.
2. Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall apply to any mechanical road cleansing vehicle, gully emptying machine or the like.

Disabled Bay

3. Two Disabled Bays will be made as specified in Schedule 2.

Pedestrian Zone-Prohibition of all Vehicles except permit holders 11:30am to 06:00am Monday to Sunday

4. No person shall, except upon display of a valid permit within the hours specified in Schedule 3 to this Order, or with the direction or permission of a police constable in uniform cause or permit any motor vehicle to proceed in that length road specified in column 1 of Schedule 3 to this Order
5. Nothing in Article 4 of this Order shall render it unlawful for a person to cause or permit a vehicle to proceed in the length of road specified therein within the specified time if it is being used for police, fire or ambulance purposes or permit holders.

Waiver Certificate

6. The Council may issue a Waiver Certificate on receipt of an application and may impose such terms and conditions as it deems appropriate.
7. A Waiver Certificate may be cancelled at any time at the sole discretion of the Council and shall thereupon immediately cease to be valid. Notification of such cancellation shall be in writing to the holder of the certificate at any address that the Council believes to be that person's address and the certificate shall forthwith be surrendered to the Council.

Contravention of Order

8. If a vehicle is left in a prohibited or restricted road without complying with the requirements of this Order, a contravention shall have occurred and a penalty charge shall be payable. A notice showing the information required by the appropriate legislation may then be issued in accordance with the requirements of the legislation or any subsequent applicable legislation and/or the vehicle may be removed from the location.

Indications as evidence

9. The particulars given in the notice attached to a vehicle in accordance with Article 8 shall be treated as evidence in any proceedings relating to failure to pay such penalty charge.

Restriction on removal of notices

10. Where a notice has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 8 no person, not being the driver of the vehicle, a police officer in uniform, a civil enforcement officer or some other person duly authorised by the Council shall remove the notice from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the keeper of the vehicle.

Immobilisation

11. If a vehicle is left after a penalty charge has been incurred, a civil enforcement officer in uniform or a person acting under his/her direction may attach to the vehicle an immobilisation device and a notice in accordance with the relevant statutory requirements and that vehicle shall only be released from the device on payment of the penalty charge along with such release fee as may be required by the Council.

Removal of vehicle

12. Where a civil enforcement officer has removed or caused to be removed a vehicle in accordance with Article 8:-

- (a) he / she shall provide for the safe custody of the vehicle;
- (b) the Council shall be entitled to recover from the person responsible such charges in respect of the removal, storage and disposal of the vehicle as it might prescribe from time to time;
- (c) the provisions of the Act of 1984 as amended shall apply to the disposal of such vehicles removed by or on behalf of the Council pursuant to this Article.

13. Nothing in Articles 8 or 11 shall apply in respect of a vehicle displaying in a relevant position a valid disabled person's badge.

14. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirements imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.

Amendments and Revocations

15. The following Orders will be amended or revoked to the extent that it relates to the lengths of roads specified in the Schedules to the Order:-

- e. THE COUNTY BOUROUGH OF WREXHAM (WREXHAM TOWN CENTRE) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING –TAXI RANKS) ORDER 2007

Schedule 1- Rhosddu Road-West Side- From a point 54 meters south of its junction with Egerton Street for a distance of 35 meters in a southerly direction

- f. WREXHAM COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCIL (PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING AND PARKING PLACES) (CONSOLIDATION) ORDER 2008 is varied or revoked to the extent that it relates to lengths of road in which restrictions are identified in the Schedule to this Order.

16. This Order shall come into operation on the 14th April 2025 and may be cited as The County Borough of Wrexham (Various Roads) (City Centre Traffic Regulation Order) Part 1 2025


