# THE WYCHAVON DISTRICT COUNCIL (OFF STREET PARKING PLACES) (CONSOLIDATION) ORDER 2004

The Council of the District of Wychavon ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 32, 35 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the 1984 Act") and under the Road Traffic Act 1991 as amended (whether generally or in relation to the area of the Council) ("the 1991 Act") and of all other enabling powers, with the consent of the Worcestershire County Council in accordance with Section 39(3) of the 1984 Act and after consulting with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with paragraph 20 of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, hereby make the following Order: TRUE COPY OF THE ORIGINA

### PART I

# en icitor to Wychavol

### <u>GENERAL</u>

- 1. (1) This Order shall come into operation on the 11th day of October 2004 and may be cited as "The Wychavon District Council (Off Street Parking Places) (Consolidation) Order 2004."
  - (2) Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order, the Off-Street Parking Places Orders as specified in Schedule 2 are revoked on the date that this Order comes into operation.
- 2. (1) Any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or to a numbered Schedule is a reference to the Article or to the Schedule bearing that number in this Order.
  - (2) In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:-

"charge certificate" means the statement that the penalty charge has been increased by 50 per cent in accordance with paragraph 6 of Schedule 6 of the 1991 Act

"charging hours" means any period specified in column 5 of Schedule 1 in respect of which a charge is specified in Article 20.

"disabled persons badge" and "disabled persons vehicle" has the same meaning as in The Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000 "driver", in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place, means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place;

"motor car or light commercial vehicle" means a mechanically propelled vehicle, the unladen weight of which does not exceed 1525 kilograms and which is less than six feet six inches in height and shall include a motor cycle but only when that motor cycle has a sidecar attached which is either:-

- (i) constructed solely for the carriage of not more than twelve passengers and their effects exclusive of the driver; or
- (ii) constructed for the conveyance of goods or burden of any description

"motor cycle space" means any area of a parking place as defined in this Article which is provided for the leaving of a motor cycle and indicated by markings on the surface of the parking place or signed or otherwise indicated by signs or any other structure whatsoever placed or erected in the parking place;

"motor coach" includes any vehicle constructed for the carriage of passengers which does not fall within the definition of "motor car or light commercial vehicle" contained\_above

"motor vehicle" or "vehicle" means "motor car or light commercial vehicle" as defined in this Article and also any mechanically propelled vehicle intended or adapted for use on roads, whether or not it is in a fit state for such use and includes any trailer intended or adapted for use as an attachment to such a vehicle, any chassis or body with or without wheels appearing to have formed part of such a vehicle or trailer and anything attached to such a vehicle or trailer;

"owner" has the same meaning as in Sec 82(2) of RTA 1991

"parking attendant" means any officer of the Council who is authorised to supervise and control vehicles in the parking places and enforce the provisions of this Order pursuant to Section 63A of the 1991 Act

"parking bay" means any area of a parking place as defined in this Article which is provided for the leaving of a motor vehicle of a class specified and indicated by markings on the surface of the parking place or signed or otherwise indicated by signs or any other structure whatsoever placed or erected in the parking place

"parking place" means any area or areas of land specified by name in Column 1 of Schedule 1 provided by the Council under Section 32(1) of the 1984 Act for use as a parking place;

"pass" shall mean a ticket issued by the Council on such terms and/or conditions as it shall decide permitting a driver to use a parking place

"concessionary ticket" shall mean a ticket issued by the Council on such terms and/or conditions as it shall decide permitting a driver to use a parking place

"penalty charge" means a charge as stated in Article 24 of this Order as amended from to time in compliance with the provisions of Section 74 and Schedule 3 of the 1991 Act

"PCN" means a penalty charge notice issued or served by a parking attendant pursuant to the provisions of Section 66 and Schedule 3 of the 1991 Act

"relevant position" means:-

- (a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen the badge pass or ticket as the case may be is exhibited thereon with the front side facing forwards immediately behind the windscreen so that the same is readable from the outside of the vehicle
- (b) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen the badge pass or ticket as the case may be is exhibited in a conspicuous and readable position on the vehicle
- 3. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament and as if for the purposes of that Act this Order were an Act of Parliament and the Orders revoked by Article 1 were Acts of Parliament thereby repealed.

#### PART II

### **USE OF PARKING PLACES**

- 4. Each parking place may be used, subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a parking place for such vehicles or classes of vehicles in such positions and on such days and during such hours as are specified in relation thereto in Schedule 1.
- 5. Where in Schedule 1 a parking place is described as available for vehicles of a specified class or in a specified position the driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that parking place unless it is:
  - a) of the specified class and;
  - b) in a position so specified.

No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to park in a space marked for Disabled Persons unless the vehicle displays a Disabled Persons badge <u>and</u> the vehicle is driven or used by the disabled badge holder.

- The driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in a parking place for longer than the maximum period permitted for waiting specified in Schedule 1 in relation to that parking place except for vehicles as defined in Part III paragraph 21
- 7. The driver of a motor vehicle using a parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in a position in the parking place, and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the parking place.
- 8. The right of passage within a parking place is available only to persons driving or being conveyed in motor vehicles and does not extend to pedestrians other than the drivers of vehicles or their passengers leaving or returning to their vehicles and no rights of way whatsoever over the parking place other than for the purpose of parking or removing vehicles shall be deemed to have been granted by the Council.
- 9. No person shall drive a vehicle into or in a parking place unless:-
  - (1) he or she is the holder of a licence authorising him or her to drive a motor vehicle of its class or description on a road, or
  - (2) he or she is the holder of a provisional driving licence and is accompanied in that vehicle by a person holding a licence of the type mentioned in (1) above
- 10. The driver of a vehicle shall not permit that vehicle to wait in a parking place unless the vehicle is licensed in accordance with the provisions of the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994 and unless there is in relation to the use of the vehicle by the driver such a policy of insurance as complies with the requirements of the Road Traffic Act 1988.
- 11. No person shall except with the permission of any person duly authorised by the Council drive any vehicle in a parking place other than for the purpose of leaving that vehicle in the parking place in accordance with the provisions of this Order or for the purpose of departing from the parking place.
- 12. Where in a parking place signs are erected or surface markings are laid for the purpose of:-
  - (a) indicating the entrance to or exit from the parking place, or

(b) indicating that a vehicle using the parking place shall proceed in a specified direction within the parking place

no person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle (i) so that it enters the parking place otherwise than by an entrance or leaves the parking place otherwise than by an exit, so indicated, or (ii) in a direction other than that specified, as the case may be.

- 13. A person shall not drive a vehicle in a parking place at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour.
- 14. No person shall use a parking place as a means of passage or of proceeding from one road to another road.
- 15. The driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in such part of a parking place as is marked by lines studs or other indications so as to indicate its provision as a parking bay for:
  - a motor cycle unless the vehicle so permitted to wait is a motor cycle without a side-car attached thereto;
  - (2) a disabled persons vehicle unless the vehicle so permitted to wait is a vehicle which displays in the relevant position a Disabled Persons badge;
  - (3) a coach unless the vehicle so permitted to wait is a coach.
- 16. (1) No person shall leave or permit to be left in a parking place:-
  - (a) a trailer of any kind including a touring or any other type of caravan without its traction unit;
  - (b) any vehicle having a secondary generating motor for the purposes of a refrigeration unit or any other purpose unless he ensures that at all times whilst the vehicle is so left the secondary generating motor is not in operation
  - (2) No person shall permit any vehicle left in a parking place to be used in such a manner as to generate any excessive noise so as to cause a nuisance whether by fumes or otherwise to other lawful users of the parking place or residents living near to the parking place.
  - (3) No person shall permit any vehicle (or caravan) in a parking place to be used for residential purposes or to be occupied overnight

- 17. When the driver of a vehicle drawing a trailer permits the vehicle or the trailer to wait in a parking place for the purposes of this Order the vehicle and the trailer shall be deemed to be separate vehicles and the driver shall be deemed to be the driver of each of the said vehicles.
- 18. In a parking place no person shall:-
  - (1) erect or cause or permit to be erected any tent booth standing building or other structure without the written consent of the Council;
  - (2) light or cause or permit to be lit any fire;
- 19. If in any case owing to the presence of a vehicle in a parking place an accident occurs whereby personal injury is caused to a person other than the driver of that vehicle or damage is caused to a vehicle other than that vehicle or to any other property whatsoever (including the parking place) the driver of the vehicle shall stop and if required so to do by any officer agent or servant of the Council or any other person having reasonable grounds for so requiring give his or her name and address and also the name and address of the owner and the identification marks of the vehicle and details of his or her certificate of insurance.

### PART III

#### PAYMENT FOR PARKING

20. (1) The driver of a vehicle using a parking place shall immediately on the parking of the vehicle in the parking place pay the appropriate charge in accordance with the Scale of Charges specified in Column 7 of Schedule 1;

Provided that no charge shall be payable in respect of:-

- (a) a vehicle left in a parking place if there is displayed on the vehicle, in the relevant position, a valid season ticket issued in respect of that vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 22;
- (b) a vehicle left in a parking place if there is displayed on the vehicle in the relevant position a pass or concessionary ticket;
- (c) a motor cycle left in a motor cycle space
- (2) The charge referred to in the last preceding paragraph shall be payable by the insertion of an appropriate coin or coins into the apparatus or device situated on the parking place

- such apparatus or device having been specially or generally approved by the Secretary of State for such purpose.
- (3) The driver of the vehicle shall attach any ticket issued on payment of the charge referred to in paragraph (1) of this Article in the relevant position on the vehicle in respect of which it was issued and shall ensure that the whole of the front of the ticket is clearly visible.
- (4) The driver of the vehicle shall ensure that a ticket or tickets are purchased and displayed as described in the preceding paragraphs to cover the entire period that the vehicle is parked in the parking place.
- (5) The driver of the vehicle shall ensure that the ticket for the period is easily identified and that other similar tickets that are no longer valid are removed from display.
- 21. The following vehicles left in a parking place namely:-
  - (a) an invalid carriage as defined in Section 136(5) of the 1984 Act;
  - (b) a vehicle issued to a disabled person in lieu of an invalid carriage;
  - (c) any vehicle so left if there is displayed on the vehicle in the relevant position a badge issued by any local authority in accordance with the provisions of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 2000, or any subsequent regulations amending or re-enacting the same and
    - (i) the vehicle is one in respect of which the badge has been issued; and
    - (ii) at the time the vehicle was left in the parking place it was being driven or used by the persons or institution to whom the badge was issued; and
    - (iii) any period shown on the badge as being the period in respect of which it was issued is still subsisting

shall as regards the parking places specified in column 1 of Schedule 1 to the 2004 Order on the days of operation of the said parking places specified in column 4 and during the hours of operation of the said parking place specified in column 5 be permitted to wait free of charge and will be exempt from any limitation on time and from the payment of any charge specified in column 7 of Schedule 1.

- On certain Parking Places the Council may permit the owner of a vehicle being a motor car or light commercial vehicle to purchase a season ticket at a fee fixed by the Council for a specified period in respect of the use by that vehicle of the parking place
  - (2) The Driver shall abide by the terms stipulated by the Council for the use of the season ticket.

### **PART IV**

### SUSPENSION OF PARKING PLACE

- 23. (1) Any person duly authorised by the Council may suspend the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary:-
  - (a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety;
  - (b) for the purpose of any building operation demolition or excavation in or adjacent to the parking place or the maintenance improvement or reconstruction of the parking place the laying erection alteration removal or repair in or adjacent to the parking place of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas water or electricity or of any telegraphic line or traffic sign;
  - (c) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture from one office or dwellinghouse to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository;
  - (d) on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any street will be thronged or obstructed;
  - (e) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place at times of weddings or funerals or on other special occasions;
  - (f) to enable the parking place to be used for or in connection with civic ceremonies or for road safety religious charitable sporting or educational purposes;
  - (g) for the purposes of holding thereon a pleasure fair;
  - (h) for any other purpose which the Council thinks fit
  - (2) A police constable in uniform may suspend for not longer than twenty four hours the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever they consider such suspension

- reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety.
- (3) Any person suspending the use of a parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Article shall thereupon place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that parking place or that part thereof a notice or traffic sign indicating that the use of that parking place or that part thereof is suspended and that waiting by vehicles is prohibited.
- (4) The Council at its discretion may suspend the use of any part of a parking place and thereafter may designate that part of such parking place to be reserved for the parking of vehicles being used by or engaged in the operations of the Council the County Council the Police the Post Office any voluntary or other organisation or any statutory undertaking in pursuance of Article 23(1)(f) above and any part of the parking place so designated shall be marked so as to identify that it is reserved for vehicles engaged in such operations.
- (5) No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be left:-
  - (a) in a parking place or any part thereof during such periods that the use of that parking place or that part thereof is suspended or during such period as there is in or adjacent thereto a notice or traffic sign placed in pursuance of paragraph (3) of this Article;
  - (b) in any part of a parking place marked as being designated by the Council in pursuance of paragraph (4) of this Article unless with the express written permission of the Council.

### PART V

### PENALTY CHARGE AT PARKING PLACES

24. (1) If a vehicle is left in a parking place in contravention of or in non-compliance with this Order a penalty charge shall be payable by the owner (subject to the provisions of Section 66 and Schedule 6 of the 1991 Act) for each day of the said contravention or non-compliance.

- (2) The penalty charge shall be in the sum of the following amounts:-
  - (a) £60 on the issue of a PCN subject to being discounted to £30 if payment is received by the Council as provided in paragraph 5 of this Article within 14 days of the issue of the PCN
  - (b) on the issue of a "charge certificate" in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 6 of Schedule 6 of the 1991 Act the penalty charge shall be increased to the sum of £90
- (3) Where a penalty charge has been incurred a parking attendant may attach to the vehicle in a conspicuous position a PCN which shall comply with the requirements of Section 66(3) of the 1991 Act.
- (4) Subject to Article 21 nothing in this Article shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled persons vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled persons badge to wait in the parking places referred to in Part I of the Schedule.
- (5) Payment of the penalty charge to the Council shall either be by electronic transfer cheque postal order or by cash in person which shall be delivered or sent by post so as to reach the relevant Department/Office of the Council as stated on the PCN not later than 4.30 p.m. by the date specified on the PCN but should the said Council Department/Office be closed on the said date specified the period for receiving payment may be extended until 4.30 p.m. on the next full working day.
- (6) The particulars given in the PCN attached to a vehicle in accordance with this Article shall be treated as evidence in any proceedings relating to failure to pay such penalty charge.

### RESTRICTION ON REMOVAL OF A PCN

25. When a PCN has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with any of the foregoing provisions of this Order no person other than a person authorised by the Council in that behalf or the owner or driver or a person authorised by the owner or driver in that behalf shall remove the PCN from the vehicle.

### **PART VI**

### **REMOVAL OF VEHICLES**

- 26. (1) Subject to the proviso hereto when a vehicle is left in a parking place in contravention of any of the provisions of this Order or a vehicle is used in a parking place in contravention of any of the provisions of this Order a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from a parking place **PROVIDED** that when a vehicle is waiting in the parking place in contravention of the provision of Article 5(b) a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with that provision.
  - Any person removing or altering the position of a vehicle by virtue of the last preceding paragraph may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as they may think necessary and may take such measures in relation to the vehicle as they may think necessary to enable him to remove it or alter its position as the case may be.
  - (3) When a person authorised by the Council removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle from the parking place in accordance with the provisions of the preceding paragraphs they shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for its safe custody.
- 27. Any person duly authorised by the Council may move or cause to be moved in case of emergency to any place they think fit any vehicle left in a parking place.
